MEMBERSHIP CHANGES



Prior to coming to the Seminary, Bode was assistant to the pastor (2005-08) and assistant pastor (2004-05) at Salem Lutheran Church in Affton, Mo.

Bode and his wife, Rachel, have three children; Nicholas, Jacob and Katharina. They live in Glencoe, Mo. His hobbies include reading, hiking, music and making firewood.
