Faithful in All Things

Sometimes we see Christians debate what obedience should look like. Does obedience include the "big things" or does obedience include the "details of doctrine" as well? Jesus said, ""Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you tithe mint and dill and cumin, and have neglected the weightier provisions of the Law: justice and mercy and faithfulness; but these are the things you should have done without neglecting the others. "Who then is the faithful and sensible slave whom his master put in charge of his household slaves, to give them their food at the proper time?" (Matt 23:23).

The Pharisees were stringent in their dealings with the Law and the barriers that they had put up to keep them from breaking the Law. The details were important to them. The Pharisees also seemed to struggle with what Jesus called the "weightier provisions of the Law." Virtues are often more difficult to shape and practice than ritual.

Contemporary debates seem to emphasize a dichotomy between the importance of doctrinal details and Christian virtues. Sometimes more "liberal" leaning folks emphasize virtues while more "conservative" leaning folks emphasize the doctrinal details. Jesus was neither—he taught Christians to practice the details and the weightier matters. Christians should want God to be sovereign over every miniscule piece of their lives and fill every possible space of their hearts. When we are completely submissive to him and filled with his love, we can be faithful in all things.



The 2nd Monday of October is noted as Columbus Day. It is a day to recognize Christopher Columbus arrival in the Americas in October 12, 1492. History is good for us to remember. Without Columbus discovery where would we be today? Yet with Columbus Day has also come controversy as Native Americans see it as a day an intruder came to their shores. A much different scenario plays out in the Bible, while some Jews see Jesus Christ is an intruder on their power John 11:48 "48 If we let him thus alone, all men will believe on him: and the Romans shall come and take away both our place and nation." ,yet we realize from scripture Jesus was the fulfillment of prophecy. Micah 5:2 "2 But thou, Bethlehem Ephratah, though thou be little among the thousands of Judah, yet out of thee shall he come forth unto me that is to be ruler in Israel; whose goings forth have been from of old, from everlasting." I once was studying the Bible with a man who believed in the false notion that we are saved by faith alone. I showed him the only place in the Bible where that phrase is used.

"You see that a man is justified by works and not by faith alone" (James 2:24 NASV).

And instead of bowing to God's will, the man got angry and tore (ripped) James 2 out of his Bible and said, "That's not in my Bible!"

He was disagreeing with God. And when we refuse to follow God's will in our lives—whether it involves morality or scriptural worship or the plan of salvation or church government—if we refuse to follow God's commands, we are disagreeing with God.

"If you love me," Jesus said, "you will keep my command-ments" (John 14:15).
