Hearing God's Word:

Today we celebrate Children's Sabbath Sunday! Children's Sabbath Sunday is a multi-faith initiative engaging places of worship across the country in focusing their prayers, worship, and action on learning more about the urgent problems facing our nation's children exploring sacred texts and teachings that call us to love and protect children, responding with outreach and advocacy, and most importantly, inspiring year-round action to improve lives of all children. Some of the scriptures we will be exploring include Exodus 33:12-23; Psalm 31:2-3; and Mark 10:46-52.

Jesus Heals a Blind Man

Then they came to the town of Jericho. As Jesus was leaving there with his followers and a large crowd, a blind beggar named Bartimaeus (son of Timaeus) was sitting by the road. He heard that Jesus from Nazareth was walking by. The blind man cried out, "Jesus, Son of David, please help me!" Many people scolded the blind man and told him

to be quiet. But he shouted more and more, "Son of David, please help me!" Jesus stopped and said, "Tell the man to come here." So they called the blind man. They said, "Cheer up! Get to your feet. Jesus is calling you." The blind man stood up quickly. He left his coat there and went to Jesus. Jesus asked him, "What do you want me to do for you?" The blind man answered, "Teacher, I want to see again." Jesus said, "Go. You are healed because you believed." At once the man was able to see again, and he followed Jesus on the road.

Family Reflection: Listen to Me!

Today is a special day called "Children's Sabbath." Children's Sabbath is a time to remind grown-ups and everyone that children are very special and it is important to love, listen to, and take good care of all children. Children's Sabbath is also a day that children think about how they can be loving and helpful to other children. We celebrate Children's Sabbath in church because we know that God loves every child and God listens to and wants to help every child.


"In one part of the Bible, God's people wrote poems and prayers and songs to God, telling God how they were feeling and how they wanted God to help them. Sometimes they were happy and thankful. Sometimes they were angry. Sometimes they were scared. Sometimes they were sad. Sometimes their feelings were all mixed together. It's ok to have all of those feelings. We can tell God that we have those feelings. And we can tell our parents and other grownups who love us about all of our feelings. We can even tell our friends about our feelings.

One of God's people in the Bible said a prayer that went like this: "Listen to me, God! Help me quickly, God! Help me feel safe with you, God!" God's people are God's helpers. That is what this special day is all about, a chance for us to tell the grownups in our church how they can be God's helpers by listening to us, helping us, and making sure we feel safe.

So together let us say and commit together to listen, act, and be the church:

Children say: Listen to us, church! Help us when we need it, church! "Help us feel safe with you, church! Thanks be to God. Amen!

Adults say: We'll listen you, children. We'll help you when you need it. We'll help you feel safe with us, children. Thanks be to God. Amen!

Family Discussion:

God is always here to listen to us, from the very youngest to the oldest. There is nothing we are feeling or experiencing that we cannot share with God. God loves us and listens to us. 


