

DB's Dabblings: "Church Calendars"

You might be surprised to hear that "Church Calendars" are challenging. I am so thankful we have Linda Stewart and Denise Kribbs to superintend the Graham Street Church Calendar. In addition to regularly scheduled activities at our main building, the Family Center and the Campus Center, they handle reservations for building use by the community. The more church family ministry and service in our community, the more complicated our church calendar becomes. All our ministries (Celebrate Recovery, Missions, Basic Needs, Campus Ministry, Young Moms, Bible Classes, Small Groups, Prison Ministry, etc.) serve better when they are scheduled on the church calendar where our ministry staff can answer church and community questions about their schedules of service. But what is more challenging to our scheduling is trying to keep it all in tune with the mission of our church.

This time of the year, from now until the first of the year, is very busy and complicated for our church and its families. I thought it might be helpful to look at some group events we have coming up and what we are doing to help us better enrich our family connections and our service in the community. This is in addition to regularly scheduled events by the various ministries of this church.

Wednesday night, Oct. 27, we will have the meal as usual at 5:30 and an adult Bible class in the auditorium at 6:30, but because of the Stephenville Safe Trick-R-Treat, our Church Fall Festival, and the Casserole give away, Thursday night, Oct. 28, our Family Bible Class we will not meet. Instead, we are encouraging the parents to move their family outing from Wednesday night to Thursday night and enjoy the activities of Fall Festival and Safe Trick-R-Treat. So, on Wednesday, several of our congregation, including our teens in REVIVE, will be working in preparation for Thursday night, including preparing casseroles. You are invited to join the fun and volunteer on both Wednesday and Thursday nights. Don't forget we will need more casseroles than ever, so please donate casseroles or money to purchase them.

Sunday night, Oct. 31, no evening service.

Wednesday night, Nov. 3, We will not have a meal, classes, or REVIVE at the church building. This is the night for the big Bonfire before game with Brownwood. This is an extra big deal for our church this year with our connections to the football team and all the players, coaches, cheerleaders, parents, fans, etc. So, we are going to meet in the city park at 6:00 and have pizza and a devo then go to bonfire. Sunday Nov. 7 Cross-Connect Regional Youth Event at Graham Street this will impact some of our Sunday afternoon and evening events in the Family Center. Prep for the Basic Needs Garage Sale is also scheduled to begin this day. Wes is coordinating with Deborah Swanson and Jacob Russell to begin the loading of garage sale items in the trailers for transport, but they will not be unloaded into the Family Center until the end of Cross-Connect that evening.

Wednesday, Dec. 15 will be our Community Christmas Dinner, and this will also serve as the Night for the Casserole Giveaway in December.

Wednesday Night Dec. 22, we will not have Bible Classes, but we will have a special Family Christmas Devotional.

Sunday Dec. 26, (the day after Christmas), we will only have our 10:00 Worship Service. We will not have Bible Classes, Children's Church, or the 4th Sunday Luncheon.

Wednesday Night, Dec. 29, we will not have services or Bible classes at the building.

Scheduling building use and church activities on the Church Calendar can be a complicated process, but more importantly it takes prayer and wisdom to schedule what is best for the benefit of our family connections and our service in the community. Thank you for your understanding, patience and cooperation in the effort to make the best use of our resources to the glory of God.


