Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time 24th October 2021

The gospel we hear today provides a vivid account of the healing of Bartimaeus, a blind man. A little earlier we heard of James and John asking for a favour from Jesus and Jesus saying to them "What do you want me to do for you?" The same question is asked here. But whereas before the disciples showed they understood neither who Jesus was nor what it was to follow him, here we see that Bartimaeus fully understands who Jesus is – the Son of David, through whom God has pity on his people – and sets out to follow him on his way.

Consider what Bartimaeus asks Jesus for. He might have asked for a little money or food, something that would relieve his poverty. But, full of faith, he speaks boldly and directly to Jesus – "Lord, that I may see" – and he immediately receives both physical healing and spiritual healing.

It is an invitation to us to recognise the presence of God in our lives and in response, filled with faith, to be bold in our prayer and our expectation. Filled with the humility which cries "have pity on me" our faith should lead us to ask not just for a little change in our circumstances or situation, but for a deep change that is worthy of the designation 'salvation'.

There are many things we might pray for at the moment: the living well together in our common home which is needed to address the challenge of climate change; the healing of the scars of child abuse in the lives of individuals, the church and wider society; the ending of conflict and injustice which drives migrants from their homes; the transformation of the weaknesses in our selves which prevent us from living fully and freely. The story of Bartimaeus stands as an example of, and invitation to, faith which leads to the deep change which is God's wish and gift for us.
