North Park Church is blessed to have a Pastor dedicated to serving our youth for going on 7 years. That is four times longer than the average tenure of a youth pastor. DEAR PETER PAN & CHOOSY MOM.

In regards to PBJ, I've been praying for my heart to be receptive to God's calling in my life, but someone told me that I have to pray for someone outside the church. Am I praying wrong? — **CONFUSED PBJER**

DEAR CONFUSED PBJER,

We certainly need to be praying for receptive hearts to God's direction in our day to day life, so that is fully in line with the hope for PBJ prayers.

At the same time, the other person is right in that part of what we are praying and asking God to do is to provide opportunities to love others outside of our church, though it does not need to be a specific person.

However, even though the intention is to bless others outside the church, the Spirit might direct you to someone in our church that needs a loving touch. If so, follow through on it. That totally counts! PBJ is ultimately about offering ourselves to God in prayer and then following through when he gives us opportunities. - PETER PAN

DEAR CONFUSED PBJER,

Nope, you're not doing it wrong! PBJ is a tool we can use to assist us in stretching ourselves to obey God's call in our life. Stretching can be uncomfortable, but those stretching places are unique in each of us and how God calls us and uses us is also very different than how he may use a friend and fellow church member.

God may be calling some of us to stretch our roles or relationships within the church to better support and equip those who He is calling to stretch outside of the church.

The P (pray) is a time when we get to talk with God to ask Him when, where, how or with whom He would like us to stretch ourselves.

It sounds like your "someone" friend is praying and asking God, "with whom" while your prayer is asking more along the lines of, "Help me to know when You answer my when, where, how or with whom questions." These are both excellent prayers that God delights to answer! - CHOOSY MOM




REBEKAH STITES:

Do you ever decide not to pray because you don't know what to say? Don't worry! God loves it so much when you talk to Him. He wants you to talk to Him anywhere and about anything!





HITTING THE PRAYER WALL

No, I'm not talking about dropping by the prayer wall at the back of church, though, you should certainly do that. I am talking about hitting a wall with prayer, especially in PBJ prayers for opportunities to love others. Are you feeling like you just want to stop praying? Maybe you're finding it boring to ask for the same thing each morning. Maybe you're not sure if anything is happening, and it feels useless. If you started off a month ago with some excitement and are wondering where it has gone, guess what? You're not alone.

When we piloted PBJ, we all had a lot of excitement when we started. We were curious about what God was going to do and perhaps a bit nervous about what God might ask us to do in response to our prayers. However, at about a month to six weeks into our discipline of praying, we noticed the excitement waned, and it almost abruptly grew hard for all of us. Yes, it was just a simple prayer, but it suddenly felt like a chore to keep up the habit of offering ourselves each day to God with the simple prayer of "Whom should I bless today?"

If you're there today or if you hit this place in the next few weeks, first of all, know this is normal. The second thing I encourage you to do is to share it with others. If you're in a care group, tell them. If you don't have a care group, share it with another friend you have in the church. Letting others know what you're experiencing helps us not feel isolated. Finally, I encourage you to keep offering yourself to God through these simple prayers. Like the importunate widow in Luke 18:1-8 who annoys the judge into hearing her case, Jesus invites us to be persistent in prayer. However, I would invite you to start praying about what God is revealing about your heart through all of this.

I don't know what God may be doing in you, but when that initial season of dryness in prayer for PBJ opportunities hit our group, we all realized that we needed God more than we ever imagined. We had started off pretty confident in our desire to see the process through and were quickly confronted with the reality that our stamina was not very deep. We needed God to transform our hearts to even want to pray this 30 second prayer each morning. If you're not feeling motivated to keep praying this simple prayer, maybe you can back up one level and pray another: "Lord, help me be the kind of person who wants to pray and ask you for opportunities to love others each day."

On the other hand, you might not be feeling like you've hit a prayer wall, and God has been giving you opportunities to love others on a regular basis. If that's where you find yourself as you read this, great. Feel free to share that with your North Park friends as well and don't forget to tell us since we're collecting stories about God's goodness to help motivate us to stay faithful.
