A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR CLINT

As we come to the last quarter of 2021, a new year sits just around the corner. We are planning a change of committee structure in the coming year; we've been talking about this for quite some time within the Session. With the exception of the Nominating Committee, all church committees are an extension of the Session; that is, committees are the way that Session has chosen to organize areas of deliberation and ministry that are the responsibility of Session. Our current structure is five Session committees (Christian Education, Finance & Memorials, Personnel, Property & Grounds, Worship & Music), three Deacon committees (Congregational Life, Membership, Mission in Motion) and two joint committees (Communications and Nominating). Of the ten committees we currently have, only six are actually meeting and have ongoing work. While Session can choose to organize its work in any manner it deems appropriate, the *Book of Order* makes it clear that even the committees that currently exist as Deacon Committees or Joint Committees are actually extensions of the life of the Session. The single exception to this is the Nominating Committee which is an expression of the congregation and lies outside the authority or oversight of the Session. Several committees will continue with their current scope and description: Property and Grounds and Worship and Music (renamed the Worship Arts Committee). The Finance & Memorials Committee will be merged with the Personnel Committee into a new Administration Committee. The rationale here is that 2/3 of our expenses are personnel related and combining the two committees will shorten decision-making loops. The Christian Education Committee will broaden into a Nurture and Discipleship Committee responsible for what would broadly be called "spiritual formation.: Within First Pres, this committee will take up the responsibilities of both the current Christian Education committee and the non-meeting Congregational Life Committee. Mission in Motion will expand its already excellent work to oversee how First Pres expresses its faith outside the walls of the church. The new domain of this committee will be local and non-local missions as well as church growth and outreach.

The Deacons will continue to organize and lead our Pastoral Care groups which have been incredibly helpful over the last year. Benevolence (both within our church and within the larger community) will also fall within the scope of the Deacons.

So, next year we will have six committees, down from our current 10:

- Administration
- Property & Grounds
- Worship Arts

- Nurture & Discipleship
- Mission & Outreach
- Nominating

I would encourage every stakeholder in the life of First Pres Kearney to find one committee into which they can invest themselves and make that part of your spiritual journey. Find the thing you are passionate about and become part of the conversation about how that area of the church moves ahead.

In the next few months, we will have a couple of open conversations where you can ask questions about the upcoming structure (or anything else that is on your mind). The first of these will be on November 17th. One will take place at 3 p.m. followed by an evening session at 7 p.m. Bring your questions!

I look forward to our journey together. Let us have the courage to ask the two most fundamental questions in the life of any faith community: what is God doing in our world, and how can we play a part in what God is doing in our world?

MISSION IN MOTION OCTOBER PROJECT

Our October Mission Drive focused on the Ilturisho Primary School in Narok, Kenya that started in 2010. Pastor Clint and his previous congregation provided funds that built the first permanent classroom and the started the lunch program of maize and beans. The school has since grown to 500 students and money is needed to support the lunch program, to build

more toilets since there are currently only 3 pit latrines, and to provide additional desks to reduce the ratio of four students per one desk. The school's mission statement is: To create a haven for academic excellence, restoration of hope, and self-reliance. Our financial support of \$2750 for this school will help them in their mission!
