DB's Dabblings: A Great Season for Church and Family

I have always loved this season. As a boy, it was the time for football, hunting, basketball, Thanksgiving, Christmas; what's not to love about the fall season? The air turns cool and crisp, the leaves turn colors and fall, and family seems to get together more than ever. I loved our trips to visit grandparents, aunts and uncles and cousins. I loved the great meals with foods different from what we would ordinarily have, especially the desserts! I loved going with my dad and brother to cut down a tree, bring it home and decorate it as a family. Thanksgiving and Christmas were both days of thanks and joy. It was a great time of the year!

But the church I grew up in struggled with the season. While every family in the church seemed to be like ours and loved celebrating Thanksgiving and Christmas, it was not celebrated as a church. I write this with respect for my heritage, which if you grew up in the Church of Christ, where some would say the first "c" should not be capitalized, you may have had the same experience. To a large extent, the reason for this absence of church celebration was our sense of loyalty to a "thus saith the Lord" application of Scripture. "Speak where the Bible speaks, and be silent where the Bible is silent." If there is no "command, example, or necessary inference" that we should observe Thanksgiving or Christmas as a church, then to do so would be adding to the Word of God, and therefore forbidden. Added to that conviction was that there was not evidence in the Bible that we were to observe December 25 as the Lord's birthday, and for that matter we don't even know that there were exactly 3 wisemen.

While this respectful attitude toward God and His Word is to be admired, the hermeneutic can be questioned. My boyhood church's approach to the season caused me to feel a bit conflicted. You may recall, this was the church where my dad was an Elder for 46 years! To my dad's credit, he would tell our family that we were celebrating Thanksgiving and Christmas as a family in the way we felt best for us, but there were families that did not celebrate so as a church we don't celebrate out of respect for their feelings. But one might easily ask, why would you discourage a church from joining in the celebration of giving thanks to God for his wonderful blessings including the gift of His Son? Why would we insist on making the silence of Scripture be a prohibition rather than a freedom? Why not instead of forbidding the church from joining in the celebration for the sake of those who thought it forbidden, encourage all of the church who wished to celebrate with praise to God to do so while showing understanding for those who chose to not participate for conscience reasons?

I am grateful to be a part of a church family that encourages participation in the spiritual opportunities of this season. While trying to be respective of those who may choose to opt out, our church family provides opportunities for participation as a church in a "Tree of Thankfulness" and a "Community Christmas Dinner" for the good of both our members and nonmembers alike. We encourage members to be engaged in the culture of the season to best use both religious and secular opportunities to "put in a good word for Jesus" and show his love to those in need. And I am proud to be a part of a church family that emphasizes being a family for those who miss having a family most at this time of the year.

World Bible School is partnering with us in this effort and has challenged their supporters to match the funds that we raise. Graham Street has surpassed our goal of \$20,000. \$10,000 of the total came Mary Batchelor's gift to the congregation. Each Bible cost \$8.50. We were able to raise **\$21,345.56**, and with matching funds it will be possible to purchase at least 4,700 Bibles!




