Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time 7th November 2021

If you turn up at Sikh gurdwara you will often find langar, free food from the common kitchen. At large Scout camps my Sikh colleagues will often provide free flowing popcorn as an expression of this, explaining that this practice keys into so many different aspects of their life and spirituality.

Almsgiving, a focus of the Liturgy of the Word this Sunday, should be given the same central place in Christian life and spirituality. Let me offer some reasons.

Almsgiving recognises and proclaims the universal destination of the goods of the earth. When we give bread to a poor man, we give him what is already his, but was given to us to look after. The current debates about climate change and climate justice extend this principle to the responsibility we have for future generations. We are stewards, we are invited by God to share in the care of what has been given by him. Private property is important (because things are looked after better when held privately, as could always be seen in the student microwave), but it is not absolute.

Almsgiving helps us grow in freedom. As Pope Francis said back in 2014, it "helps us to experience giving freely, which leads to freedom from the obsession of possessing, from the fear of losing what we have, from the sadness of one who does not wish to share his wealth with others." It helps us to develop an 'attitude of gratitude' rather than one of entitlement and this in turn helps us to be happy.

Almsgiving, especially when we give out of our core resources and not just what is left over, gives witness to our faith – it shows that we know that God will provide and inspires others to place their trust also in the Lord and to not despair. It has a missionary quality.

Almsgiving is part of the "Social love [which] makes it possible to advance towards a civilization of love, to which all of us can feel called. With its impulse to universality, love is capable of building a new world. No mere sentiment, it is the best means of discovering effective paths of development for everyone" (Fratelli Tutti, 183).

As we start to prepare for Advent and for Christmas it's not too early to think about how our almsgiving in this season might help our happiness and that of others.
