This Thursday, St. Luke will observe Veteran's Day with a special liturgy at our 11:30 AM Low Mass to honor and bless our veterans. Everyone, especially our retired servicemen, are encouraged to join us for worship and the remembrance of the sacrifice of our nation's veterans.

Special Latin Mass

On Wednesday, November 17th, St. Luke will offer a special Gregorian Latin Mass in honor of our 12th-century saint of the month, Hugh of Lincoln. The use of the Latin Mass originates far back into the 7th century of our English Catholic patrimony, and its nine hundred year tradition as the standard of our Christian worship made it the basis of the Holy Communion liturgy in the first Anglican Prayer Book of 1549. Fr. Trout and Lance hope that this Latin Mass will be of interest to both our summer Latin class students and all parishioners that appreciate our traditional Western rites. The Mass will be celebrated following an abbreviated 6:30 p.m. Evensong, and everyone in the parish invited and encouraged to attend. *Gratias agamus Domino Deo nostro!*

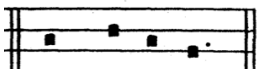

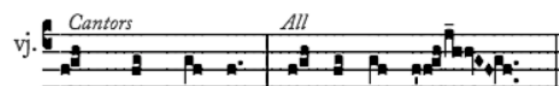

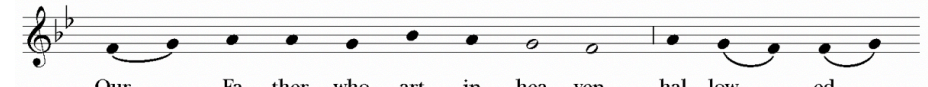
