Small Group Questions

1. Getting Started:

- What did you find most interesting about the sermon this week? The most helpful, eye-opening, or troubling?

2. Into the Bible (1 Corinthians 10:1-13)

- Verses 1-5: Which stories is Paul referring to in this passage?
 What ultimately happened to the people who lived through those stories?
- Verses 6-10: What kinds of failures did the Israelites commit that led them to fail in the Wilderness? (Bonus: which stories is Paul referring to here?)
- In both passages Paul refers to Jesus as being part of the Wilderness stories. What part did Jesus play? How was he present in the Wilderness?

 Verses 11-13: What are we supposed to learn from the Wilderness stories, according to Paul? How should our behavior be different?

3. Going Deeper

- What are some of the big picture issues that God has commanded Christians to take on? How do those big pictures intimidate us?
- God told the Israelites to focus on the next step instead of the big picture. What are the next steps for us in facing our big pictures? What small things can we do to take on those big issues?
- Where is God calling you specifically to take a next step?
 What can you commit to doing in your life to take on God's mission on Earth?
