Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time 14th November 2021

"There will be a time of great distress"

This wasn't a promise that was made to God's people of old in a time of peace and prosperity. It was something that they experienced as part of their lives – whether in exile, under threat of war or violence, experiencing economic and political instability or perhaps even the turbulent times that can arise in families and households.

It is in the context of distress that the apocalyptic passages of the scriptures emerge, providing reassurance that even these very troubled times can be brought within God's wider plan, that he will be with his people through it all and that in the end the honour and flourishing of his people will be restored and his honour will be vindicated.

The philosopher, Martin Heidegger, described the difficulty that we experience in living rightly in the face of death – that we tend to marginalise or suppress this essential part of human living. To be Christian is to have a right relationship to death and to the reality of an end time and judgement. It is to see these things as parts of our being human in which the love and mercy of God is revealed. Much of the time they sit on the edge of our prayer and reflection, but in these last weeks of the liturgical year and in the first part of Advent we are invited to open our hearts and mind to them, that we might have a richer and fuller appreciation of God's providential care for us and the depth of his plan and thereby journey in faith and hope even when things get rough and our hearts are broken.

On Wednesday of this week we will visit the cemetery in Milford and bless the graves there. Do take time this month to visit a cemetery and pray for the faithful departed, even if your own family rest in places far away from here. They are visible reminders to us of our communion with those who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith and provide an opportunity for us to come close to them while we await our own death, resurrection and judgement.
