

Prayer Stations

Do Justice Prayer Station: We are the church! We are called to act justly! God created you to be special and gave you unique gifts. How is God calling you to love, respond and participate in our community and in our world? What passions and concerns tug at your heart? How do you envision Zion connecting to the community and the World?

Write your visions on a piece of paper and tape on the tree of life. Take a moment to prayerfully ask God to bring awareness to Zion to act justly.

Love Kindness Prayer Station: We are the church! We are called to love kindness! God created you to be special and gave you unique gifts. How is God calling you to love, respond and participate in our community and in our world?

Take a paper heart and write or draw how God is using you to bring love and kindness into our community and our world. Put the paper into the tree of life and remember that we are connected in love as siblings in Christ. Light a candle on the altar as a reminder that we are the light of the world.

Write your visions on a piece of paper and tape on the tree of life. Take a moment to prayerfully ask God to bring awareness to Zion to act justly.

Mandala Prayer Station: Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18)

Mandala means "circle." A Mandala represents wholeness and reminds us that our relationship to God extends beyond and within our bodies and minds. Jesus calls us to always rejoice, pray and give thanks. The Mandala reminds us life is never-ending, just as our relationship with God and one another never ends. Traditionally, Mandalas are used for meditation. May this Mandala reveal to us, Zion Church, what we should do to grow in faith.

Take a moment to pray for our congregation and your own role here. Color part of the Mandala and leave it for others to complete.

May our separate colors blend together just as separate gifts make up the Body of Christ.

Planted by Streams of Water by Rev. Alex Shea Will

The Psalms often compare us to animals in search of water. In the 23rd, we are the sheep who drink from calm waters. In the 42nd, we are the deer, longing for God as the deer longs for the stream. But in the 1st Psalm, something is different. We are not the animals passing from stream to stream. We are the tree, fixed in the riverside. Our roots running deep and wide, nourished by the waters of God's mercy and love, and the collective ecosystem. While I love the beauty of the 23rd and 42nd Psalms, the imagery of the 1st Psalm is the most moving because it is the image of life in Christian community. We do not come and go from the stream, taking only what we need, when we need it. Our roots are firmly planted and growing deeper and stronger by the day. We not only take from the ecosystem, but we also contribute to it. We're committed to this spot, this ecosystem - no matter the changing of the seasons. In a culture where it is easy to pick up and look for a new stream, covenant calls us to plant something lasting. My financial generosity to the church is one way I declare that I am not merely passing by; I'm planting roots. It's how I proclaim that I am invest- ed in the flourishing of our riverside. It's how I communicate that my thriving depends on our thriving.

Let us pray: Gracious God, inspire my generosity so that my roots grow deeper and stronger. Amen.


