#### Be Nice and Stay Off the Naughty List

Who is the nicest person you know? Wouldn't it be great if there were more people like that? Wouldn't the world be a better place?

Paul said, "Love one another with brotherly affection Outdo one another in showing honor" (Rom. 12:10-11). It is easy for us to slip into trying to outdo the people around us. We want to feel important, be liked, and enjoy the attention of others. This is not the way.

The Greek word translated "outdo one another" in Romans 12:11 is usually translated as "to go first" or "to lead." So, we could read Romans 12:11 as "take the lead in showing honor." The more you exemplify niceness, the more you will lead others to be nice as well. If you exemplify anger, laziness, crankiness, or bitterness, then you will lead others to exemplify those behaviors and attitudes. We want the world—our world—to be a better and nicer place. Be nice. Your life will be better. Be nice because people around you need some nice things in their life. We don't know all the bad things people are struggling with, but you can imagine how important it is for you to have a little encouragement every day. Be that nice person in someone's life every day. Be nice because "there is no poison more effectual in alienating the minds of men than the thought, that one is despised...; so the best fomenter of love is humility, when every one honours others" (Calvin, *Romans*).


### Welcome to Lomax!

The present-day American practice of Thanksgiving descended from the first Thanksgiving in Plymouth, Massachusetts in 1621, 399 years ago. It is a unique holiday because it doesn't commemorate a special event such as a battle or a birthday. It is simply a day set aside to tell God thanks for his many gifts.

Many people misunderstand what motivated the pilgrims of Plymouth to declare their thanksgiving feast. The Pilgrim Fathers were not celebrating their abundant harvest, they were celebrating the God who gave them that harvest.

They were not taking that time to thank the Native Americans nor were they thanking their other friends. It was a day to thank God for all who helped them!

And that is the first American Thanksgiving. It was more than being grateful for all our stuff, such as our abundance of food, the presence of our family or our enjoyment of football games. The spirit of thanksgiving that we need to recover is that of the pilgrims who were grateful that God had blessed them.

The Bible tells us that every good and perfect gift is from God (James 1:17).
