#### The Necessity of His Glory

Scripture teaches the necessity of Christ's incarnation, suffering, and resurrection. God has also taught the necessity of Christ's entrance into glory. "Ought not Christ to have suffered these things, and to enter into his glory?" (Lk. 24:26). This experience of glory was brought about at Jesus' ascension. This ascension was necessary for Christ's exaltation but also for Christ to complete his work as representative of the redeemed. Jesus' ascension provides the perfect assurance for people of faith.

Stephen Charnock, a Puritan theologian, wrote: "His exaltation, therefore, was a necessary sign that he had fulfilled righteousness and disarmed justice, conquered death and hell, and opened the gates of heaven. Since he suffered as our surety, his glory would manifestly be conferred on him because he so suffered, and therefore it would respect our interest; and though by the efficacy of his death, had he only risen again, we had been freed from those torments that remain after death, yet had he not been glorified in heaven, we could not have been restored to the happiness of that paradise we had lost, no more than our bodies could have been delivered from the darkness of the grave, had he himself remained under the chains of death....But by his glory we have a certain evidence that we are not only freed from the dominion of death, but made heirs of life, and have a pledge in our hands that we shall enjoy it....This doctrine is the highest comfort in the Christian religion; and without this, and a share in it, what comfort can we expect in the deplorable, and, I may say, stupefying dispensation we are now under?"


