

From our pastor



Advent is here, and this Sunday week we began our four week journey to Christmas, following our theme, "Close to Home." If you have not yet picked up your Advent devotionals, we will have more available for you this Sunday. In this first week, we are allowing ourselves to feel homesick. I think we've all been homesick these past couple years. I know we can never go back to what was, but I'm still hoping for something better than what is, and that's what Advent is all about. Advent is about hope, which is different than either optimism or despair. Optimism says, don't worry, things will get better. Despair says that tomorrow will be the same as today. As we looked at Jesus words in Luke 21:25-36, Jesus does not promise things will get better. His words suggest things may well get worse, and that's OK. At some point, optimism runs out of steam, and we all end up in despair, and that's when Jesus says, "Now when these things begin to happen, stand up straight and raise your heads, because your redemption is near." When the world starts to fall apart, Jesus says straighten your back, and look up because God is entering our homesick world. The hope of Advent is that God has come to us and is still coming, to dwell with you in both the darkness and the light. Emmanuel means God with us, and God has come to dwell with us in Jesus Christ, to taste every bit of despair this world has to offer

just to be near to you. God has made God's home with us, and because of that, we can look to the future with hope.




