HYMN OF THE DAY: Our hymn of the day is *I Lay My Sins on Jesus*. John the Baptist says to us in our Gospel reading, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath for come? Bear fruits in keeping with repentance...Every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire." John makes it clear that God expects good fruit from his people. Those who do not bear good fruit face judgement. But all of us have born bad fruit because of sin. Where should we go with this bad fruit to escape God's wrath? Christ. He takes our sins away. So sing out today during the sermon hymn. "I lay my sins on Jesus, the spotless Lamb of God...I bring my guilt to Jesus to wash my crimson stains. Clean in his blood most precious, till not a spot remains."

A WORD: Today's readings focus on our need for repentance. In Malachi, we hear that a messenger is coming to prepare the way of the Lord. This messenger will be like a refining fire, something that cleanses the people in preparation for God's arrival. In Luke, we meet this messenger, John the Baptist. He prepared the way for the Lord by bringing the people to repentance. Those who repented under the ministry of John received life under the ministry of Christ. We too need cleansing because the Lord is coming back. We need to repent so that we will be ready to receive life from Jesus on the last day.

The epistle reading shows us who is responsible for our salvation. We do need to repent. We do need to bear good fruit. It is our responsibility to live a life pleasing to God. But who makes us able to do this? God himself. Paul writes, "I am sure of this, that He who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ." God has begun a good work of salvation in us, and he will see it through. Thanks be to God. Amen.
