In 2008, a BBC reporter began a journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem, to follow in Mary and Joseph's footsteps. He kept a journal to document the journey for his listeners. This Advent we will read excerpts from this diary.

I am due to start where tradition has it that Mary and Joseph started. Two thousand years ago, Nazareth is thought to have been a tiny agricultural hamlet. Now, the remains of what many people believe to be Mary's home are enshrined in a massive basilica. A little way up the hill, another church houses the excavated ruins of what was thought to be Joseph's carpentry workshop. It is close to the Church of the Annunciation - where many Christians believe the angel, Gabriel, appeared to Mary in her home - that I have arranged to meet Cynthia, the donkey. From there, the two of us will head south (mainly downhill, thankfully) to the town of Afula.

"Why are you standing there with a donkey?" said an old man. "This is a nice modern city, and you're standing there with a donkey! What are you trying to say? What's wrong with you?" The road to Bethlehem is never as easy as we hope.
