# DRIVE TIME

## CONVERSATION

**PARENT PRE-READING:** *One generation will declare your works to the next and will proclaim your mighty acts (Ps. 145:4).*

**CONVERSATION STARTER:** I was reading in Psalm 145 today and it talks about how one generation will declare God's works to another. Can I share with you today one of the things that God has done in my life?

# DINNER TIME

## CONVERSATION

### STARTING QUESTIONS

What is something that I have taught you that you will teach your children one day if the Lord blesses you with kids?

**READ THIS TOGETHER** Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength. These words that I am giving you today are to be in your heart. Repeat them to your children. Talk about them when you sit in your house and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up (**Deut. 6:5-7**).

### SCRIPTURAL APPLICATION QUESTIONS

What does it mean to you to love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength?

How have you seen me do this well?

Why do you think this verse emphasizes the importance of talking about this with your family?

# ACTIVITY TIME

### LEGACY GIFTS
