Week 2: Heirloom Treasures

The truth of the gospel is that our treasure is not in this world. One of the most important lessons godly parents can teach their children is where the real treasure of this life is found. The joy of this life is not in possessions or prestige but in prayerful faithfulness and heavenly treasures.

PRAYERTIME

THIS IS YOUR DAILY SCRIPTURE:

Hallelujah! Happy is the person who fears the Lord, taking great delight in his commands. His descendants will be powerful in the land; the generation of the upright will be blessed. Wealth and riches are in his house, and his right-eousness endures forever (Ps. 112:1-3).

THIS IS YOUR DAILY PRAYER:

Hallelujah! I know a reverent awe of You will lead to my happiness. I take delight in Your commands. Your ways are powerful today. I know following You brings blessings to me and my family. True wealth and riches are in Your house and Your righteousness endures forever.



PARENT PRE-READING: But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys, and where thieves don't break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also (Matt. 6:20-21).

CONVERSATION STARTER: I was reading in Matthew 6 and it talks about storing up your treasures in heaven. What do you believe this is talking about?



STARTING QUESTIONS

When did you choose for yourself that you would worship the Lord? What was that like?

READ THIS TOGETHER Therefore, fear the Lord and worship him in sincerity and truth. Get rid of the gods your ancestors worshiped beyond the Euphrates River and in Egypt, and worship the Lord. But if it doesn't please you to worship the Lord, choose for yourselves today: Which will you worship—the gods your ancestors worshiped beyond the Euphrates River or the gods of the Amorites in whose land you are living? As for me and my family, we will worship the Lord (Joshua 24:14-15).

SCRIPTURAL APPLICATION QUESTIONS

What do you think it looks like for you to worship the Lord in sincerity and truth?

Do you think it can sometimes be difficult to live our faith out in the open for everyone to see? What might you have to sacrifice to do this well?

Why do you believe that it's important that your faith be your own and not just something that your parents believe?
