Week 3: For A Lifetime

PRAYER TIME

THIS IS YOUR DAILY SCRIPTURE:

Fathers, don't stir up anger in your children, but bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord (Eph. 6:4).

THIS IS YOUR DAILY PRAYER:

Lord, may we not stir up anger in our children. Teach us how to be parents that honor You. We desire to train and instruct our children in You, Lord.

DRIVE TIME

CONVERSATION

PARENT PRE-READING: *Be careful to obey all these things I command you, so that you and your children after you may prosper forever, because you will be doing what is good and right in the sight of the Lord your God (Deut. 12:28).*

CONVERSATION STARTER: I was reading in Deuteronomy 12 and it talks about obeying the things God has commanded so that your children may prosper. Can I share with you some of the ways that I pray for you?

STARTING QUESTIONS

Who has been a role model in your life? What about this person stands out to you?

READ THIS TOGETHER

Do what you have learned and received and heard from me, and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you (Phil. 4:9).

SCRIPTURAL APPLICATION QUESTIONS

In this passage, Paul knows that the life he talks about and lives will bring peace to others. Why is it so important that the things we do align with what we say about our faith?

In what areas of our own faith do we need to focus on putting into practice? Prayer? Service? Patience?

Do you believe that friends at school or people at my work know that I follow Jesus by the way that I act? Why or why not?

ACTIVITY TIME

LEGACY OF THE WORD

The activities this month are all about parents leaving a legacy. Yet, the legacy we want to leave is not our own but pointing our children to the Father. This month our activity is the same each week done in different ways. It's all on the shoulders of the parents giving something special to their children—God's Word.
