### Week 3: A Giving Heart

## PRAYER TIME

# DRIVE TIME

## CONVERSATION

**PARENT PRE-READING:** *Each person should do as he has decided in his heart—not reluctantly or out of compulsion, since God loves a cheerful giver (2 Cor. 9:7).*

**CONVERSATION STARTER:** I was reading in 2 Corinthians and it talks about how God loves a cheerful giver. Why do you think attitude matters when we are giving to others?



### STARTING QUESTIONS

What is the most valuable thing you own?

When you think of the word “valuable,” do you primarily think of value as financial? What are a few other things that are valuable to you, but may not have a financial value?

**READ THIS TOGETHER** *Instruct those who are rich in the present age not to be arrogant or to set their hope on the uncertainty of wealth, but on God, who richly provides us with all things to enjoy. Instruct them to do what is good, to be rich in good works, to be generous and willing to share, storing up treasure for themselves as a good foundation for the coming age, so that they may take hold of what is truly life (1 Tim. 6:17-19).*

### SCRIPTURAL APPLICATION QUESTIONS

What does it look like to “set your hope on the uncertainty of wealth”? Do you have to be rich in wealth to do this? Why do you think so?

What do you think it means to be “rich in good works”?

Can you list some practical ways we can live out this passage in the coming week?
