From our pastor

In week 2 of Advent, we heard Zechariah sing a song about God's tenderness to his new born son John in Luke 1:57-80. I'm not sure how many of us are used to thinking about God as tender. We often pray to Almighty God, but how often do we pray to All-Tender God? To us, tenderness looks weak, but it's precisely in God's tenderness that we see divine strength. God's strength is most evident in the willingness to become human, to live and die with us, all as an act of love. This season, as we prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ, may our strength be seen not in our toughness but our tenderness. Receive Rev. Sarah Are's poem inspired by this text, "Words for the Beginning" as a tender gift of love to you:

If I could give you words

so I would go on to say,

for the very beginningfor the stretches
and the yawns,
and the opening of eyes,
for the first hiccups,
and the first smiles,
and the first purse of the lips,
I would say,
"Oh, dear child,
how you are loved."

But the thing about love is you can't stop there,

And then I might say,
"This world is a mess,
but it is your home,
and you can make it better,
so always try to make it better.

And maybe most important of all: there is a love that is bigger than my understanding, that moves through this world, and I call that love God.

And that love is here,

"You are strong, stronger than you think. And you are not alonelook at these parents who adore you and these doctors and nurses fighting for you. And you are enough, already enough.

You haven't done anything yet. You've just been here, breathing, sleeping,

and already, you are enough.

here in this room, and that love knows your name by heart."

Those are the words I would say to you as you stretch and yawn and open your eyes on the very first morning of your very first day.

Let that be your foundation, like Zechariah did for John.

Let love be your beginning.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION FOR ALL AGES!

For adults, the Forum takes place in the Lounge at 9am. This Sunday, we will be joined by the local artist Cody Miller. Cody will share some of his own story with us and what animates his art.

Children gather in the Multipurpose room (former administrative offices) at 9am before splitting into our classes. We sing, read, learn and dream together. Youth (6th-12th grades) meet in the chapel at 11am for snacks and discussion.

SPECIAL OFFERING

Each year, Covenant has four special offerings. The fourth is the **Christmas Joy offering** which will be received Sunday, December 12. This money provides a lifeline for students and pastors in need. This special offering is distributed equally to the Assistance Program of the Board of Pensions and to Presbyterian-related schools and colleges, Look for more details in the Sunday bulletin.

DEACONS' CHRISTMAS EVE OFFERING

The offering at the Christmas Eve and Maundy Thursday services supports the work of the deacons. The Board of Deacons is not funded through the church budget. It is through this offering that the deacons serve our members and the community.

How does the Board of Deacons Serve? Deacons transport members to medical appointments through the C.A.R.E.S. ride program. Meals are prepared and delivered to those recuperating, celebrating births, and grieving. The deacons host memorial receptions. They are responsible for communion preparation. They also host the Red Cross Blood Drives. A special event will be held for our Super Seniors in the Spring. Emergency funding is available for members and those in the community.

Beyond our doors, a monthly breakfast is prepared and served at Ronald McDonald House. Deacons take a meal and join in fellowship with those at Hoge for HM3. We fight hunger through the Crop Walk, provide joy by organizing Adopt-A-Family at Christmas, and supply assistance to the Mid Ohio Workers Association. The deacons also extend support to the Mid Ohio Food Collective and COMPASS at Broad Street Presbyterian Church.




CAUSE COOKIES

 As a gentle reminder, the church provides disposable face masks but if possible please bring your own face mask for inside the church facilities. Thank you!


