May the Lord make you increase and abound in love for one another and for all, just as we abound in love for you. And may he so strengthen your hearts in holiness that you may be blameless before our God and Father at the coming of our Lord Jesus with all his saints.

Advent is a time of "Already, but not yet!" It is "already," because we know that God has already been born into the world as a human being, and has already brought us into God's family by his life, death and resurrection. In that sense, a time of waiting and watching doesn't make sense.

But it's also a time of "not yet." "Not yet," because, even though Christ is already born, our church calendar helps us to experience the full joy of Christmas by dwelling for a season in darkness with only hope to sustain us. Our most important spiritual discipline in Advent (and every other time of the year) is love. As we increase and abound in love for one another and for all, God strengthens our hearts in holiness. Our extra efforts at charity and service in Advent are blessed by God. We are not in our waiting by ourselves. God is with us . . . already . . . and . . . not yet!

The Season of Advent Begins November 28, 2021

(Four Sundays before Christmas)

Dr. Laurence Stookey, author of CALENDAR, writes about Advent:

"The First Sunday in Advent is regarded in the Western Church as the beginning of the Liturgical Year. But Advent is first of all about the end of time. Because the term itself means "coming" or "arrival," and because it precedes Christmas, many have misunderstood Advent to be exclusively a time to get ready to celebrate the coming of a child in Bethlehem. In fact, the primary focus of Advent is on what is popularly called "the second coming." Thus Advent concerns the future of the Risen One, who will judge wickedness and prevail over every evil."

Dr. Stookey's statements are startling because they do not agree with the popular ideas about Advent. Even many good Christian church people misunderstand what Advent is truly about. Furthermore the widespread commercialization of Advent (and of Christmas that follows) compounds the misunderstanding. One way to properly understand Advent is to study the Revised Common Lectionary (RCL) that is used during The Christian Liturgical Year.

In our Worship at Orangewood, each Sunday in Advent will have a related message printed in your bulletin to describe the chosen passages and help you understand this exciting Season. We hope you will follow along.

- 1. Our attendance throughout the fall has remained steady online as the in-person services begin to grow again. Naturally there is some uncertainty, given the recent need to shut down the office and a Sunday service, but we are grateful that our pastor is starting to feel better!
- 2. Just when the new carpet was completed in the office (and looking great!), the water heater burst, flooding the entire office, hallway, and choir room. Fortunately, Bob Wells stopped by on Saturday, November 13 and saw what was happening, so the remediation could begin immediately! Thank you, Bob!
- 3. Worship Committee is continuing its study of the book "Calendar: Christ's Time for the Church" and we can expect to see more and more information about the liturgical calendar in our worship services and bulletin.
- 4. OPC's financial condition is very sound and we are finishing the calendar year on the plus side, thanks to the continuing generosity of the congregation and the conscientious stewardship of our leaders.
- 5. The Session approved a proposal for installing solar panels on three buildings in early 2022. The Finance and Facilities Committees were thanked for their work on this project. A full description of the system its cost, locations, financing, payback period, and benefits is currently being written.
- 6. Both the Fall Festival and November SAGES meeting were well attended. The Congregational Life Committee continues to be hard at work for upcoming events.
- 7. The African Fellowship is continuing to grow and a new church may be formed in Tucson.
- 8. Mission Committee is busy with Angel Tree, Alternative Giving, and Advent Service Worship events.


