Third 'Gaudete' Sunday of Advent – 12th December 2021

I trust, I shall not fear.... With iov you will draw water from the wells of salvation!

The Responsorial Psalm this weekend is one of the great pieces of poetry from the Prophet Isaiah. The theme of trust is central to the first part of the prophet's ministry and writings. There is every reason for his hearers, God's people, to be afraid: the superpower of the day – Assyria – is on the war path and they are its next target. They are faced with a dilemma – do they trust in God or do they compromise the covenant and make alliances with neighbours (and perhaps worst of all with an Egypt from whom God saved them centuries before).

This, then, is not a song of joy because things are going well for God's people. They are not. It is, instead, the fruit of their experience that when they place their trust in God their hearts become full of joy, because they understand that God will make all things well and exercise his power in human history and will do so soon.

The wells of salvation are for us those privileged places in which we encounter the living Lord Jesus: Sacred Scripture read in church; Lectio Divina; the Sacred Liturgy; the Eucharist; the Sacrament of Reconciliation; personal and community prayer; the community of faith and love; the poor, afflicted and sick; and popular devotions. Time and time again over recent decades we have been reminded and urged to go to these sources, to be refreshed and re-energised. To draw water from the wells of salvation.

There is a lot of uncertainty around Omicron, and a good number are at best disappointed at the plans that it is upsetting and concerned about what it might mean next for them, their families, and their colleagues. It is in this context perhaps that we might read the Prophet Isaiah this Advent. Like the people of his day, we are again under threat. We will not find our happiness in the regular things of prosperity and security. But Isajah, many of the saints, and many fine people we have each known and loved, teach us that despite this, joy and deep happiness is to be found if we will drink deeply from the wells of salvation.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: The spirit of the Lord has been given to me. He has sent me to bring the good news to the poor.

COMMUNION ANTIPHON: Say to the faint of heart: Be strong and do not fear. Behold, our God will come, and he will save us.

This Third Sunday of Advent is 'Gaudete' Sunday named from the entrance antiphon 'Gaudete in Domino semper' or 'Rejoice in the Lord always'. On this Sunday rose vestments are permitted in the Eucharistic liturgy and we light the rose-pink candle on our advent wreath, the penitential purple of advent being softened by the joy of the Lord's nearness.

Lectio Divina during Advent Fr Jonathan leads a prayer reading of the Advent readings on zoom on Wednesday evenings at 7.30pm. Those who are new to this way of prayer are particularly welcome and help will be given. Do join and give it a try. (Zoom Meeting ID: 846 7892 5944, Password 2021)

Sacrament of Reconciliation. Fr Jonathan will be available after the 9.30am Mass at St Joseph's, Milford on Saturday 18th December for anyone who would like to celebrate this Sacrament. There will also be confession available all day at St Joseph's, Guildford.

Outdoor Carols at Ladywell Convent on Sunday 19th **December at 3pm** We look forward to the *outdoor* carol singing next
Sunday in the newly restored walled garden at Ladywell Convent. To provide a bit of distancing we will be asking folks to bring their own mulled wine or other hot or soft drinks. P lease bring an umbrella as we will remain outside whatever the weather.

If you are being cautious you might like to come to a Christmas Mass on the Feast of the Holy Family, which this year is on Boxing Day: 8.45am at St John's and 10.30am at St Joseph's as we expect these to be quieter.

NB There will be no 6pm Mass at St Edmund's on Saturday 25th December.
