#### The Joy of Spiritual Family



Advent has begun. The greenery has been placed around the sanctuary. My children often ask to go over to the church to "see Christmas." They plug in the lights on the tree and amble around it together. Despite the anxiety of our historical moment, people we see seem generally happier than they have been for some time. We walk to Wisebeans Coffee Shop downtown. They marvel at the Christmas decorations while sipping on hot chocolate.

At this point, it almost seems like a lost cause to try to make Jesus the center of America's holiday season. I think our culture has successfully ignored Jesus to the point where the vast majority of people love this season for reasons

other than Jesus. If anything, people love this time of year for the decorations, the parties, and the time with family. Very few now know about the importance of the Incarnation (what we celebrate on Christmas), nor the Second Coming (what we anticipate during Advent). Rather, most are content not to know why we do things the way we do. An entire country full of people who are, for the most part, disinterested in the foundations upon which they stand.

I walk around feeling like I know an inside joke, or a mystery. I think I like a holiday focused on rampant consumerism and the avoidance of death being further removed from my Lord and Savior. As our culture grows more ignorant of the domesticated Jesus who was so long taught, I feel as though our dangerous and worldchanging

Jesus has more power. As medieval people walked around Europe, they saw the ruins of a once-great civilization (the Roman Empire). Most had no idea the heights to which humans could ascend. Likewise, we today live among the ruins of a civilization ravaged by decades of hedonism and idolatry. While the forces of darkness relax in self-satisfied victory, it still cannot comprehend the light (John 1:5), which will be its doom. It was in the darkness of the ruins of a once-great Judea that Jesus was born. Suddenly, in the middle of the night, the heavenly armies appeared to shepherds, proclaiming the birth of the messiah. Likewise, Jesus foretells that the world will be completely unaware when he returns with all his angels to destroy the forces of darkness (Matthew 24:36-44).

We Christians walk around the world, not so distracted by the things around us that we cannot see the promises of God. During this season of cold darkness, our role is not to quell our misery with eggnog, shopping, decorating, or Hallmark movies (although perhaps these can be done with some prudence?). Rather, we are comforted in the darkness, because we know it has no power over the light. While the world might want to coopt Christmas, one cannot take something that belongs to the Lord of Lights. We stand secure, knowing that whether or not the world keeps 'Christ' in Christmas, we are being kept in Christ. That is a most comfortable place to be.

### A History of First United Methodist Church of Nowata (Part 3):

In 1910 the original church building was moved across the street (probably to where the senior center is currently located). A new building was built between 1910 & 1911 for a contract price of \$20,000. There was a week long dedication from February 5th to the 12th. The new building as well as a church bulletin from that week is pictured below.

The new building had a large auditorium with balcony seating on three sides and large enough to seat 1200. It served as a meeting place not only for the church but also community events. High School graduations would take place here until the High School auditorium was built in 1938.

Many of the stained glass windows that still adorn our current building to this day were purchased at this time, including "Gethsemane" which was purchased by the church's Ladies Aid Society.
