\*\* **NEBRASKA GRANT STABILIZATION ACT** - In early November the State of Nebraska announced that stabilization funds were going to be made available to childcare providers across the state. The goal of this funding was to help steady the uncertain footing that most childcares currently operate under. Helping Hands application was submitted immediately and on December 7, 2021 we were awarded \$132,400. This means that the rate increases hesitantly passed on to families can be tabled until the end of our fiscal year. Remaining funds will be used keeping good stewardship and the future of the ministry in mind.
