HYMN OF THE DAY: Our hymn of the day is *O Little Town of Bethlehem*. While all the world slept in darkness (the darkness of night and the darkness of sin) the everlasting light was born in Bethlehem. At the moment of the Savior's birth, all true hope to be found among men, and all real fear, centered on the child in the manger. This baby would fulfill all hope, giving us joy, love, and life, banishing all forms of darkness from our lives and welcoming us into the light of God once more. This baby would take away all fear, especially the fear of death, replacing it with peace that passes all understanding. The day of Jesus' birth is the day the world changed. In the final verse, we pray that Christ would come again, not to be born in a manger, but to be born in our hearts, to impart to us all the blessings of Christmas. Come to us once more, Lord Jesus

A WORD: Our Old Testament reading presents Jesus to us as the fulfillment of all God's promises. Earlier in Micah, God promised that he would save all nations, that he would bring peace to earth, and that he would gather his people. All these promises hinge on the coming of

a king who will shepherd God's people. Micah tells us that this king will be born in Bethlehem, and that he will bring all of God's promises to perfect fulfillment. In the Gospel reading, we hear glad tidings that the king is about to be born. Mary is pregnant with the Christ child, so Elizabeth greets Mary as the mother of her Lord.

The epistle reading tells us why Christ was born into the world. It answers the question, "How have God's promises come true in Jesus?" The answer is that Jesus perfectly fulfilled the Father's will, presenting his own body as a sacrificial offering on the cross. Because of Jesus' sacrifice, our souls are cleansed from sin, we are reconciled to the Father, and even now the blessings of heaven are being given to us through Christ.

BIBLE READINGS FOR NEXT SUNDAY: Exodus 13:1-15 Colossians 3:12-17
Luke 2:22-40
