JANUARY MONTHY MISSION FOOD HELPERS

The Washington County Food Bank has developed a new program known as Food Helpers. Thomas Church was contacted earlier in 2021 and was asked to consider being one of the sites for this program which was to be held quarterly beginning, September, 2021. Session approved the request and two distributions have been held, one in September and a second one in December. The truck to trunk program is held outside and uses the part of our parking lot near the storage barns. 23 individuals and families received food in September and 48 individuals and families received food and other products in December. All remaining food products leave with the truck the day of the distribution. Food Helpers has not requested the use of any storage space on our Church campus. Due to the growth of the program in our area, a request was made to hold Food Helpers in our parking lot monthly beginning January 2022. Session approved this request at their December meeting. Food Helpers will hold their distribution the 2nd Tuesday of the month from 9:00 - 11:00 am beginning January 11, 2022.

This program's focus is on outreach and healthy food options. They provide pre-packaged boxes of food items along with fresh produce and eggs from their 25 acre farm and from local farmers when available. They currently bring enough food to distribute to 100 families and individuals in need. This number can be increased if necessary.

Food Helpers is to serve as a short-term emergency food bank for people who have lost their jobs, have family issues, health issues, etc. This will serve those who do not qualify for the regular monthly Food Bank. In addition to the food being provided, they plan to follow up with the clients to offer help finding resources in the community to help with their particular needs.

Proxy forms are available for those unable to come to our Church. This would allow a designated person to pick up the food and deliver it to the client. We can make referrals to this program if we know of someone in need.

Volunteers are welcome to help with traffic control, greet clients, load boxes, etc. If interested, please contact Patti Korintus.

SESSION MEETING HIGHLIGHTS December 13, 2021

At its December 13th Session meeting, Elders spent time in reflection of the past year - 2021. Session commented that since Covid, we have become more intentional about our one-on-one connection to others in the congregation which has been very positive and helps us get to know one more deeply. We noted that prayer for our congregation and our relationships is important and has shown results.

The mission focus of Thomas Church is becoming more community related, and Finance is looking to be more outward looking than internal. The increase in pickle ball teams using the CLC presents opportunities to consider. Active listening to each other and to the community is key for discerning where God is calling us.

Succession Planning is a challenge due to the size of the congregation. Pastor Debbie suggested that Elders look at where they are serving now and determine if they would prefer to stay on the same team or serve on a new team. Active listening to each other will help us pay attention to gifts and interests of members.

Session is grateful for Pastor Debbie's leadership. She is grateful to be here.

The prayer of Session for tomorrow is to continue the forward movement we have noticed this past year and that the sense of joy that the church is experiencing continues to grow.

Session joined together in the "Prayer Seeking God's Guidance."

Clerks Report:

Motion was made, seconded, and passed unanimously to elect Norma Itani as Clerk of Session. Peggy Flynn and Kathi Durkin committed to helping Norma with responsibilities such as record keeping.

Ordination/Installation: January 9th will be the date of the ordination and installation of new Elders and Deacons

Congregational Meeting: January 16th has been set as the date for the next Congregational Meeting

<u>Christian Education-</u> (Report Submitted) Kathi Durkin

• Reported that a Team of 4 individuals has met to review and develop Christian Ed opportunities

<u>Mission Outreach and Service-</u> (Report submitted) Keith Korintus

Motion made, seconded and passed unanimously to move the distribution day of Food Helpers from the third Wednesday to the second Tuesday of every month beginning January.

<u>Finance-</u> (Reports submitted) Jim Hixon Motion made, seconded, and passed to accept the Rev. 1 of the 2022 Operations budget at \$193,605

Motion made, seconded, and passed to increase the percent allocation of undesignated contributions for Mission from 3% to 4% in 2022. This will provide an additional \$900 (approximately) to Mission. Mission Team will evaluate how this investment will make a difference.

Motion made, seconded, and passed to increase the hourly cost for the use of the CLC from \$10 to \$12.50 per hour. The increase will address increased costs as well as the potential of adding a staff person to coordinate and support the increased CLC activities.

Discussion on forming a task force to explore the addition of a staff person to coordinate and support CLC activities for 8 hours a week and to write a position description for this position. The task force will include representatives from Hospitality, Staff, Finance, Mission and Building and Grounds. Capital Campaign—A task force will be formed to explore how to proceed with the Spiritual Growth/Mission component of the Capital Campaign

<u>Building and Grounds-</u> (Report Submitted) Jim Hixon

It was reported that the furnace in the lobby of the CLC is not working and will need to be replaced. The current estimate for this is \$10,000.00
