Where We Are

Hampden Township, PA is a spacious suburb in Northeastern Cumberland County. It covers over 17 square miles between the state capitol of Harrisburg and the county seat of Carlisle. New Covenant Fellowship church sits in the heart of the township adjacent to the towns of Shiremanstown, Enola, Mechanicsburg, and Camp Hill. The winding Conodoguinet Creek makes several large bends just past the church, through the township, on its way to the Susquehanna River and the Chesapeake Bay. 195,000 people live in the zip codes of the members of New Covenant Fellowship. The church building is located 1.5 miles from the Creekview Rd exit on PA 581, part of the Northwest corner of the Harrisburg Beltway.

If Hershey Chocolate is your favorite, we're only about half an hour west of where your sweets are manufactured. Several of our members are a part of Hershey.

If American history is one of your hobbies, our church is less than an hour north of the incredible site of the battle of Gettysburg. We are also 2 hours west of Philadelphia, 1.5 hours north of Baltimore, and 2 hours north of Washington D.C.

Our Story

New Covenant Fellowship first placed an ad in a local newspaper calling families interested in starting a conservative reformed church in the fall of 1971. They held their first official service as Grace Reformed Presbyterian Church on Feb. 13, 1972. The church particularized in 1975 under Pastor John Woll and took the name New Covenant Fellowship. Some time in the 1980's New Covenant Fellowship joined the PCA. Construction on the current building began in 1990. The church has been faithfully led by 7 pastors from its inception in 1972 to the present day.

Janie Conway


