What You Need to Know to Teach the Bible

You can teach the Bible! God's people have many opportunities to share the gospel. God has blessed his people with many opportunities to teach the Scriptures to others. We should always be prepared, then, to explain to others what God has said. How can we teach the Bible?

1) **Know the Lord.** Before we can teach or prepare to teach, we should always pray. Prayer is the most powerful weapon we have against the powers of evil. We dare not study or teach without depending on the Lord.

2) **Know the Scripture.** Before we can ever teach a text, we must be taught by the text. Choose the passage that you will teach. Then, read the passage repeatedly. I like to read the passage I will teach repeatedly (maybe 100 times) until I can see what God communicates in the text. Reading the passage repeatedly should reveal the main idea of the text and the main points that God has revealed in the text.

3) **Know the Answers.** Ask questions of the Scripture. Once you have discovered the main message and the supporting material from the passage, then you will do well to ask questions of the text. Some of the questions I ask are: Why is that passage there? How does the passage fit with the story of Scripture? What does the passage teach about God, salvation, humanity, and Christ specifically? How does the passage lead to worship?

4) **Know your Audience.** Now that you have all this material, you will be able to find a way to share the passage in an organized and appealing way. This is where you build your outline and then your manuscript. Then you can practice delivering this lesson to your audience.

5) **Know the Application**. Each Scripture applies to each of us in some way. We want to point out that application from the Scripture to our audience so that they will be able to glorify God in their lives from the lesson learned in the Scripture you taught.

In this process, you have discovered what God has said and found an acceptable way to share it with others. You can teach the Bible. Prepare a lesson this week. You never know when you will have an opportunity to teach.

What Will You Do With The New?

Toward the end of the year, we begin to focus on the "new." We enjoy giving and receiving "new" presents, and we look forward to the hope of a "new" year. A blank calendar page represents fresh opportunity, but what will we do with it?

Hezekiah was known as a man who received renewed opportunity from the Lord. A godly king, Hekeziah destroyed the idols in Judah (2 Kings 18:4) and trusted God (2 Kings 18:5-6).

When Assyria came knocking on the door threatening to destroy Jerusalem, Hezekiah prayed (2 Kings 19:15-19), and God spared Judah. When Hezekiah fell ill, and God told him that he would not survive, Hezekiah again went to the Lord in earnest prayer, and God extended his life by 15 years (2 Kings 20:1-6).

Two challenges in Hezekiah's day were overcome by going to God in prayer. The nation now had renewed hope, and Hezekiah especially should have been filled with new enthusiasm for the future after God spared his life.

However, when a third challenge presents itself, Hezekiah seems to display resignation and selfishness. Isaiah reveals to him that Babylon would soon come and take away the wealth of Judah, as well as Hezekiah's own descendants (2 Kings 20:16-18). Instead of meeting this challenge with more prayer, Hezekiah says, "The word of the Lord which you have spoken is good!" and "Will there not be peace and truth at least in my days?" (2 Kings 20:19). Hezekiah was given new opportunities, but he was content to live with his personal blessings, and gave no prayer for the future generations.

As Christians, we have been cleansed by the blood of Christ, and walk in newness of life. We've had our lives extended eternally! But what about the lost around us? What about future generations? Will we be content with our own salvation, and give no thought, prayer, or action for the salvation of others? What will we do with the new?
