
- We will continue to be focused on God's Word and Sacraments in our times of worship.



TRINITY BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING Monday, November 1, 2021 7:00 PM

CALL TO ORDER & DEVOTIONS

The meeting was called to order by Eric Young. Pastor Rob led us in devotion. Acts:18:5. Paul arrived in Corinth. He devoted himself fully to the Word, testifying to the Jews that Jesus is the Christ. Do not be afraid! Do not be silent! He stayed a year and 6 months teaching the word of God. Most of the Jews didn't like him, but some did follow him. Within the Corinth Church, there were lots of troubles. Every Sabbath he tried reasoning and persuading both the Jews and the Gentiles.

Pastor asked for prayer requests & led us in prayer. Prayers for healing for Pastor Rob, Deb, Gerry Bauer, Jared's father & Don's harvest help, Brad Heil.

MINUTE CORRECTIONS

Josie motioned to approve the minutes as corrected, and Don seconded the motion. Minutes were approved.

TREASURE'S REPORT

Report attached. Pastor Rob reported that we are still sitting good. No noticeable drops in giving. The building fund isn't receiving as much. Don may do a giving report to remind the congregation that the building fund is still in need.

EDUCATION REPORT

Josie reported that Trunk or Treat was moved indoors due to the wind. Very well attended. The Christmas program will be held on December 15th at 6:30 pm. The kids will start practicing soon. Don added that soup will be served prior to the program. Julie offered the help of the Youth if help is need for the program.

ELDER'S REPORT

Kyle reported that the Elders met on October 18th and after an opening prayer, spent the remainder of the time on the 2022 TLC Budget. A copy of the completed budget was the forwarded to Pastor Rob who will bring the document to the Board of Directors meeting on November 1st for final approval. Those present at the Elders Meeting were Larry Fisher, Don Batie, Quentin Daily, Mike Thome, Marcus Porath, and Rick Trampe. The group finished with the Lord's Prayer.

INREACH/OUTREACH REPORT

The committee met in the library on October 25th, 2021. Members present were, Peg Fisher, Dana Thornburg, Francie Stieb, LaDonna Kwiatkowski & Pastor Bill. LaDonna created and mailed 39 birthday cards and 6 anniversary cards for October. Trunk or Treat is outside again this year from 4:30-6pm. Everyone is welcome to decorate a vehicle trunk, wear a costume, and hand out goodies to the children of the community. Peg received a Thrivent grant for Trinity Thanksgiving baskets, she will send out a note for the bulletin/newsletter asking for names that could benefit from receiving a Thanksgiving Basket. Peg contacted the Parent/Child center for angel tree names. The responded positively but have not sent a specific list of names yet. Pastor Bill shared some evangelism ideas from the church workers conference including follow-up visits with church guests that have filled out an attendance card. LaDonna is to come in on Mondays to review the names and reach out. The committee will meet again on Monday, November 29th at 5 pm in the church library.

PLANNING REPORT

The committee met Sunday, October 24th. Hosted Pastor Appreciation for both Pastor Rob & Pastor Bill on the 24th, also. We had special cupcakes and for the program had a "bouncy" good time. We will be participating in the LLL Chili Cookoff. We will be having a retirement farewell for Pastor Bill & Jackie on Sunday, December 12th. Details to follow.

STEWARDSHIP REPORT

Don will do an update on the building fund & giving. The contribution envelopes will be here & they will get them labeled.

TRUSTEE REPORT

Jared Bauer is our new guy. The furnace filters have been replaced. Lights in the social hall may need to be looked at. He will work on removing ceiling tiles. The new phone system should be here within 2 wks. Maria's phone is the only one that is actually ringing now.

YOUTH REPORT

Julie reported that the youth attended Fields of Faith on October 13th at the Lexington High School. They participated in Trunk or Treat on October 27th The butter braids will be arriving on November 3rd. The youth group will be making chili on Wednesday, November 10th to participate in the LLL Chili Cook off. They will not be meeting on November 24th. They will be serving on November 28th and the month of December. Julie has been sending monthly e-mails to both parents and students. Registration is opening today for the National Youth Gathering. Pastor asked if Julie wanted to have an informational meeting. November 20th & 21st is the Middle School State Convention in LaVista. During Advent, they plan to do a craft & devotion after service. They are averaging 3 youth per night.

PASTOR'S REPORT

Pastor Bill was not present. But he did submit his report stating visitations have been a little difficult in respect to the care facilities for the past two months. Covid is still causing sporadic shutdowns and he has been unable to visit several of our shut-ins because of that. He has been able to make several home visits however. He will continue his efforts to visit the care homes as they open up. He and Jackie are spending most of their time packing and downsizing from almost 30 yrs at the same residence. Thankfully they are still speaking with each other despite the frustrations to go along with this. They are planning to make their move complete in the first part of January.

Pastor Rob reported that he has a telehealth meeting with his surgeon sent for 11/10/21. He is hoping to be able to move to just the cane. He has been doing some meetings by Zoom. Reformation Services was held yesterday. He will be working out the schedule for Christmas, Advent & New Years. Ann Young is stepping away from decorating for Christmas, so we will be looking for someone to do this. We need to let Donna Phillips know if we have a name for our chili – she is going to be making name cards.

OLD BUSINESS

We will wait on forming a by-law committee until 2022.

NEW BUSINESS

Budgets were submitted by each board. Budget requests were reviewed. Some areas may go down because of Pastor Bill's retirement, mileage, benefits, conference & workshops. We have increased the Guest Pastor budget since we haven't been having to pay anyone when one of the Pastors were gone. Elders were questioning the cost for Webmasters, this is what Alan Gierhan has been working on. Pastor changed the amount on Devotional materials, Portals of Prayer, as these amounts have increased. NACC went down by supporting Concordia any student gets a scholarship, so far, we have 3 students. Note changes to Maria's salary, lowered postage cost, increased streaming budget to \$1200, this includes bank fees, check purchasing, stop payments. Increased insurance amount. Budgeting for organist in case we do need to use it. Overall, the budget is down from last year. Don moved to accept the budget as presented and Kyle seconded the motion. The budget was approved.
