CONSISTORY HIGHLIGHTS

We welcomed Pastor Katie's invited guest, Reverend Sheresa Simpson-Rice, to join our December consistory meeting. Sheresa is an Associate Conference Minister within the Central Atlantic Conference of the United Church of Christ whose focus is on developing leadership.

During the committee reports, Lisa answered questions about various companies that we do business with. She also offered to complete the Financial Secretary's Report since Rae is employed in another position at this time. Katie noted that we received a new member on our rolls but also lost a long-term member. Our membership numbers appear to be steady. She also explained the plan for the Longest Night service and noted that Soup Kitchen guests will be encouraged to join in this special service. Kim talked about the special multi-generational Advent Sunday School study focusing on the story, "How the Grinch Stole Christmas."

A draft of the amended and updated ZION Articles of Incorporation (formerly called Constitution) and Bylaws were given to the Consistory members for their review. A discussion of the changes is planned for the January Consistory meeting. Once the Consistory has approved the changes, these two documents will be presented to the Congregation for a final vote of approval at our planned spring congregational meeting, date to be determined.

Under Old Business, Katie shared information about job performance reviews, goal setting, and the need for a new job performance evaluation tool. Becky presented a Covenantal Agreement for the Consistory. After much discussion it was decided to let the new Consistory determine if such a document is needed.

The topics for the December 12th Congregational Meeting were reviewed including which members are on the ballot for the 2022 Consistory, the proposed 2022 budget, and consideration of a possible year-round uniform worship time (to be voted on at the spring meeting).

Under New Business, Becky and Katie presented a new format for committees in hopes of streamlining the number of committees that exist and maximizing the manpower we have to do the committee work. This too will be a topic for discussion in 2022 with the new Consistory.

Sheresa spoke about developing a shared vision for Zion which is especially important as we move forward with our search for a settled minister.

This marked Becky's last Consistory meeting. The Consistory thanked Becky for her leadership especially with the many structural issues that she addressed.

Parish Nurse Notes

Why Do We Do This? A Parish Nurse Note ~ January 2022



Why do we worship? Do we really understand what happens when we worship? Is worship just a weekly ritual that we perform from memory? Is worship just singing and music? Is worship just taking communion? How do we know if we are worshipping correctly? What exactly do we get out of worship? In this new year, maybe we can figure this out; maybe we can be sure to be true worshippers.

Worship is more than going through the motions on Sunday or other days of the week. Worship is a selfless act. It is a lifestyle, not just something we do for a few hours every week. In order to be an effective worshipper, you must actively magnify God as well as express reverence and adoration for God. Why should we do this? Studies have shown that actively worshipping changes your brain (for the better) and improves your health! Some researchers believe that our brains are wired to communicate with God. A study of Carmelite and Franciscan nuns showed actual changes in brain structure and an immune system that was up to 5 times stronger – believed to be related to worshipping God. Those who attend church regularly were found to have a 30-35% less chance of early death from digestive, circulatory and respiratory problems as well as better stroke prevention. Vanderbilt University study results showed that non-worshippers had higher scores in stress related health areas (blood pressure, cholesterol and inflammation). Those aged 40-65 who attended church regularly also had a 55% reduction in their mortality rate; this was attributed to decreased stress.

When you truly worship, you let go of yourself. You shift your focus from yourself and your problems to seeking God. Your heart is renewed through worship and healing takes place. You are refreshed and are able to put your life and your problems in perspective. Doors can be opened or doors that are detrimental can be closed. Forgiveness is received and guidance is shown. You find that God's love and protection are freely given. Glory is given to God and that same glory will eventually be experienced by those that truly worship. It is impossible to truly worship and not be filled with love. As God fills your heart with love, you are able to pass that on to others. All these things that happen during worship are great for both your mental and physical well-being. It's free for the taking if you just make yourself available!

As we embark upon a new year, let's try to focus on being a true worshipper of God.....and many good things will fall into place. Be an active worshipper every day of the week, no matter where you are or what you are doing. Your body, soul and spirit will benefit, and so will those around you!




