

From the Pastor

"Love Lights the Way" is not only our new Faith Promise theme for this year, but it is our churchwide theme for 2022 as well. Think about what the

theme means:

- ⇒ LOVE is the new command that Jesus gave us in John 13. He said, "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another" (John 13:34-35 NIV). Love is what compels us to share His love with others. There's a reason our mission as a church is to "Love, Grow and Go."
- ⇒ **LIGHTS** Jesus is the light of the world (see John 8:12). In the Sermon the Mount, Jesus called us to shine His light. He said, "You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven" (Matthew 5:14-16 NIV).
- ⇒ THE WAY Jesus said, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me" (John 14:6 NIV). The way to true life, abundant life, and everlasting life is only through Jesus.

Love lights the way so others can know Jesus as their Savior. It is the "why" of everything that we do and are as followers of Jesus. Let's shine God's light in all that we do and are in 2022!

BlessEveryHome.com — website that gives you the tools to become a Light for Christ in your neighborhood. You can even receive optional daily reminder emails with a prayer prompt and 5 neighbors to pray for that day.

Our annual collection of shoeboxes filled with gifts for children (and delivered through Samaritan's Purse around the world) went great last year:

- ⇒ 65 shoeboxes were packed during our "packing party" in November.
- ⇒ An additional 24 shoeboxes were provided by church members.

- Have attended Hoodview Church of God regularly for a period of at least six (6) months. A waiver of the sixmonth period is permissible for those requesting such a waiver by a majority vote at the meeting.
