With that, space is at a premium. Therefore, in cooperation with the Church, we are in the beginning phase of a new building project. The building will be located on the vacant lot just north of the Church. When the building is completed, the Closet will move to the street level floor, opening up an additional

1000 square feet for racks and bins.
