A variety of gifts

St Paul is clearly very fond of the Corinthians, but he finds himself needed to give them some clear teaching to help them get over disputes around the more spectacular spiritual gifts and their unfortunate practices of social division in their meals. Over these three weeks we read his teaching on 'spiritual phenomena', prompted by his desire that they have a clear understanding about them, and possibly by a question that they have asked him.

All spiritual gifts have the Holy Spirit as their same source and serve the same Lord. One of the insights of the Second Vatican Council was that while we know for certain that the Holy Spirit operates in the church, the body of Christ, that is not to say that he is not at work beyond its visible structures in order to draw those who are currently outside into the mystery of Christ.

Spiritual gifts are given for a good purpose – very often referred to as 'the common good', and in Ephesians 4 as 'building up the body of Christ'. Gifts are not given for the honour or benefit of the recipient, but for the good of the community. There is a practical test of the authenticity of spiritual gifts – not whether they make the recipient feel good, but whether they serve to build up the church (or sometimes to divide it).

Paul's list of gifts is by way of example, not exclusion. There are other gifts – all part of the rich variety of gifts – that he does not mention here.

Gifts are given at God's pleasure. They are not given on account of merit (otherwise they wouldn't be gifts). We might wonder sometimes at God's choices, about what and why he has given to us and to others, but the journey of faith suggests that we should carefully discern spiritual gifts and trust that God knows what he is doing and chooses well.

Paul's teaching on spiritual things will finish with his discourse on love. It is a reminder that this is the real measure of the spirit at work in us and in others, often at work in the hidden but precious daily lives of God's children.
