## **Answers to Sermon Notes**

"The Terms of Our Testimony, Part III: Trusting in His Sovereign Care" Acts 23:10-35 1/16/22

- 1. Are you **afraid** to testify?
  - **a.** Do you <u>fear</u> what testifying to the truths of Christ might <u>mean</u> for you?
  - **b.** Do you secretly wish that God would **spare you** from having to testify in any significant way?
  - c. The truths before us this morning are designed by God to take away those thoughts and fears.
- 2. Looking to Paul as our **example** as he engages in this ongoing formal testimony we have seen:
  - **a.** That our testimony is **founded** on testifying to the personal transformation we have experienced through a **saving** encounter with the risen Christ.
  - **b.** That we must be **intent** on testifying within proper boundaries:
    - a. Proper <u>Legal</u> Boundaries
    - b. Proper **Behavioral** Boundaries
    - c. Proper Creative Boundaries
- 3. This morning we see that our testifying must also be done while **trusting** fully in God's sovereign **care**.
  - a. As we do so we want to look at three aspects of this.
    - a. Just what is this, "sovereign care of God," that we are to trust in as we testify?
    - b. What does it **look like** for us to actively trust in it?
    - c. What are the **results** of trusting in the sovereign care of God as we testify?
- 4. What is this, "**sovereign care** of God," that we are to trust in as we testify?
  - a. God is sovereign over (in control of) all things. (Eph. 1:11, Dan. 4:35, Prov. 16:9)
  - **b.** God <u>uses</u> his control of all things to <u>care</u> for his own. (Ps. 139:1-17, Rom. 8:28-30)
    - a. He is sovereign over both the **macro** plan and every **micro** plan. (Mt. 10:26-33)
  - **c.** Given that at the heart of our recreated **purpose** in this world is to testify, God has prepared a **specific** plan for how he will use the testimony of each believer. (vs. 11, Jn 21:18-22)
    - a. Each call to testify is a **divine** appointment.
    - b. And intended to be a **specific** part of his sovereign, unfolding **plan**.
  - **d.** Because God is sovereign the plan is **certain**, and he will provide all that is **needed** in order to accomplish it.
    - a. Some possible questions:
      - i. How can the plan for my testimony be certain when I am so **uncertain**?
      - ii. How can the plan for my testimony be certain without making me a **robot**?
      - iii. How can the plan for my testimony be certain and my choices still be **necessary**?
        - a. Divine <u>Concurrence</u>: "Both God and man <u>acting</u> at the same time so that the Lord's **plan** is fulfilled and our choices are really and truly **our own**."
          - i. All past failures his plan has already **allowed** for.
            - 1. Which includes **forgiveness** for the **repentant**.
          - ii. All future **successes** he is preparing you for.
            - 1. Through things like **this sermon**.

- 5. What does it look like to **actively** trust in it?
  - a. It looks like the rest of our 4-part plan for living out the will of God.
    - a. **Trust** in His Sovereignty.
      - i. This is the **foundation**, and what we have already covered above.
    - b. **Know** your responsibilities.
      - i. This refers here to what we **covered** in Parts I and II of this series.
        - a. That the foundation of our testimony is the testimony we give of the **personal** transformation we have experienced in our **saving** encounter with the risen Christ.
        - b. And that all of our testifying needs to be done within **proper** boundaries.
    - c. **Look** for opportunities. (vs. 12-16)
      - i. As we trust the sovereign care of God we know that he will sovereignly bring the **provisions** that we will **need**.
        - a. He does this here for Paul by bringing to him the **news** of this **conspiracy**.
      - ii. Part of trusting his sovereign care is **embracing** the opportiunities he brings.
        - a. The **Drowning** Man Joke.
    - d. Walk by faith. (vs. 17)
      - i. Taking action regarding what God has provided.
- 6. What are the **results** of trusting in this sovereign care of God as we testify?
  - **a. Courage**. (vs. 11)
    - a. No matter what happens, as we are faithful, **God wins**.
    - b. We can begin the **victory dance** as soon as we begin our testimony.
  - **b.** His plan coming **to pass**.
    - a. As we have <u>faith</u>, embracing his divine appointments and all other things he provides, his purposes are <u>sure</u> to be achieved.
    - b. This is why we note this morning that our testifying **must** be done while **trusting** in his sovereign care.
- 7. There is no reason to **fear**.
  - a. God has purposed for you to testify in specific important ways.
  - **b.** And to share the **victory** and **glory** with you, his child.
- 8. So take **courage**, and go **forward** to testify.
