## Mark 1:21-34 NASB

<sup>21</sup> They went into Capernaum; and immediately on the Sabbath *Jesus* entered the synagogue and *began* to teach. <sup>22</sup> And they were amazed at His teaching; for He was teaching them as *one* having authority, and not as the scribes. <sup>23</sup> Just then there was a man in their synagogue with an unclean spirit; and he cried out, <sup>24</sup> saying, "What business do you have with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have You come to destroy us? I know who You are: the Holy One of God!" <sup>25</sup> And Jesus rebuked him, saying, "Be quiet, and come out of him!" <sup>26</sup> After throwing him into convulsions and crying out with a loud voice, the unclean spirit came out of him. <sup>27</sup> And they were all amazed, so they debated among themselves, saying, "What is this? A new teaching with authority! He commands even the unclean spirits, and they obey Him." <sup>28</sup> Immediately the news about Him spread everywhere into all the surrounding region of Galilee.

<sup>29</sup> And immediately after they left the synagogue, they entered the house of Simon and Andrew, with James and John. <sup>30</sup> Now Simon's mother-in-law was lying sick with a fever; and they immediately spoke to Jesus about her. <sup>31</sup> And He came to her and raised her up, taking *her by* the hand, and the fever left her, and she served them.

<sup>32</sup> Now when evening came, after the sun had set, they *began* bringing to Him all who were ill and those who were demon-possessed. <sup>33</sup> And the whole city had gathered at the door. <sup>34</sup> And He healed many who were ill with various diseases, and cast out many demons; and He would not permit the demons to speak, because they knew who He was.
