### Aloha MBC O'hana,

As we have moved into a new month, it seems like we have been bombarded with difficult news. COVID cases are on the rise, the collapse of Afghanistan, the earthquake in Haiti, the destruction left behind by Hurricane Ida, and more all weighs heavily on our mind. Many are hurting, struggling, and confused, trying to understand what's going on in our world. In Job 5:11, Eliphaz reminds Job that "[God] sets on high those who are lowly, and those who mourn are lifted to safety." Now, we know something that neither Job nor Eliphaz did at that moment: God chose Job as His servant for that season of suffering. That being said, Eliphaz was still right that God cares for those who struggle and suffer. Whether you are the direct cause of your suffering or not, God is always near to the brokenhearted, and we would do well to remain close to Him. How can one remain close to God, especially in these trying times, though?

While there are many places we can turn to answer the previous question, following the guidance of Psalm 119:9-16 is wise. The psalmist asks, "How can a young man keep his way pure?" The question and answer are similar to the discussion with Solomon's "son" in Proverbs 2 and when David speaks to the "children" in Psalm 34. We ought to return to our childlike faith when determining how to grow and honor God with our lives. Whether we're young or old, struggling or not, we must seek after God with our whole hearts. We need to remain close to Him in our walk, treasuring His word in our heart, storing it there that we might remember it in our difficult moments and heed it rather than breaking its commands. Therefore, we need God to teach us His statutes; and thankfully, He has promised to do just that through His Spirit. We then need to declare His rules, delight in his statements and decrees, meditate on His principles, and not forget His word.

The pain you may be facing is real, and unfortunately, it does not go away as quickly as when one turns the page in a calendar. The presence of a new month will bring new challenges while old ones may remain. Our response ought to be to seek after God amid our struggle, for when you find Him, you will find a kind and compassionate Father waiting to comfort your weary soul. God is good, and His plans are perfect. They are also, most often, above our heads and hard to discern. We need to go to Him, study His word, find comfort in His people, and trust His guidance. At MBC, we are here for you, and we want to come alongside you and lift your burden. If you are struggling, please don't struggle alone. Reach out and let us know. We are here to pray with you, to listen to your story, and to lift you as brothers and sisters in Christ. On behalf of the staff and the church leaders, I want to tell you that you are loved and prayed for at MBC. I trust that God will draw you close, and I encourage you to hasten His drawing by seeking after Him diligently. May God bless you as you do.

Whew! We've had a fantastic first month of school and our students have been making some great strides in our transition into daily life at school. It is such a joy to see how much they have learned and grown, even in one month! They are beginning to follow routines, rules, and become comfortable with their teachers, learning new songs, and adjusting to their classroom and classmates!
