The First Lesson

Galatians 2:1-10

When after fourteen years I went up again to Jerusalem with Barnabas, taking Titus along with me. I went up in response to a revelation. Then I laid before them (though only in a private meeting with the acknowledged leaders) the gospel that I proclaim among the Gentiles, in order to make sure that I was not running, or had not run, in vain. But even Titus, who was with me, was not compelled to be circumcised, though he was a Greek. But because of false believers secretly brought in, who slipped in to spy on the freedom we have in Christ Jesus, so that they might enslave us— we did not submit to them even for a moment, so that the truth of the gospel might always remain with you. And from those who were supposed to be acknowledged leaders (what they actually were makes no difference to me; God shows no partiality)—those leaders contributed nothing to me. On the contrary, when they saw that I had been entrusted with the gospel for the uncircumcised, just as Peter had been entrusted with the gospel for the circumcised (for he who worked through Peter making him an apostle to the circumcised also worked through me in sending me to the Gentiles), and when James and Cephas and John, who were acknowledged pillars, recognized the grace that had been given to me, they gave to Barnabas and me the right hand of fellowship, agreeing that we should go to the Gentiles and they to the circumcised. They asked only one thing, that we remember the poor, which was actually what I was eager to do.

Mark 7:31-37

Then he returned from the region of Tyre, and went by way of Sidon towards the Sea of Galilee, in the region of the Decapolis. They brought to him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; and they begged him to lay his hand on him. He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, and put his fingers into his ears, and he spat and touched his tongue. Then looking up to heaven, he sighed and said to him, “Ephphatha,” that is, “Be opened.” And immediately his ears were opened, his tongue was released, and he spoke plainly. Then Jesus ordered them to tell no one; but the more he ordered them, the more zealously they proclaimed it. They were astounded beyond measure, saying, “He has done everything well; he even makes the deaf to hear and the mute to speak.”

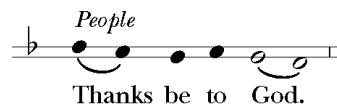
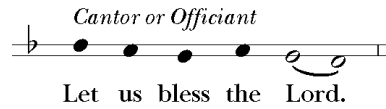



SUNDAY MORNING CLASS AT 9 A.M. The Hebrew Bible: the official prequel to Jesus and the Church. Matthew Delaney concludes his class with the story of the Hebrew Bible this week.

SUNDAY MORNING CLASS BEGINNING JANUARY 30 at 9 a.m., Dr. Bill Lyons will begin a new Adult Education course on the Old Testament – the Bible that Jesus read. More than an occasional passage read on Sunday mornings, this ancient component of our Bibles forms the foundation of the New Testament and is well-worth a focused study with your friends at church.

WEDNESDAY EVENING BIBLE STUDY: Reading the Gospels with Fr. David Beginning on Wednesday, January 26 at 6:30 p.m., we will meet in the Common Room and read through the Gospels, beginning with Luke with running commentary and teaching by Fr. David. We'll take a break for a Lenten series beginning on March 9, but after Easter we'll read the Gospels until it's time to read something else! See you there.

THE PRESENTATION OF OUR LORD This feast day falls on Wednesday, February 2, and we will observe it that day with a sung Holy Eucharist at 5:30 p.m. The Presentation commemorates a significant event in the early life of Jesus (Luke 2:22-40). His mother Mary brought him to the temple as an infant forty days after his birth for her ritual purification (the traditional offering being two doves). At the temple, the prophet Simeon acknowledged Jesus as the Messiah and foretold Jesus' future suffering as well as Mary's. Some of Simeon's words at the temple are known as the "Nunc dimittis," one of the canticles traditionally sung at Evensong (the other being the "Magnificat," Mary's song of praise in response to the angel Gabriel). This is the first time Jesus is acknowledged as the Messiah in a public space. The Gospel of Luke goes into the most detail about Jesus' birth and infancy, and many of our most cherished liturgical texts come from these passages. We hope you will celebrate this important celebration of Jesus' early life and pay special attention to the boyhood windows on the epistle side of the nave.
