Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today is designated the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time in The Church Liturgical Year that we follow. The First Sunday in Ordinary Time was the Baptism of the Lord and the last Sunday in this part will be the Sunday before Ash Wednesday, the first day of the Lent-Easter season. Why is this time referred to as ordinary? Dr. Stookey, the author of the book that your Worship Committee is studying, explains the meaning of the designated time of this period. "Ordinary Time" implies no mundaneness, as if more than half the year were dull and unexciting; it refers to the fact that in the original lectionary system the Sundays outside Advent-Christmas and Lent-Easter were simply designated by ordinal numbers: First Sunday, Second Sunday, and (so) on...' The cloth hanging on the OPC pulpit (called a parament) signifies the liturgical color of each season; purple for Advent and Lent, white for Easter and Christmas (through the Baptism of our Lord) and green for Ordinary Time. The pulpit paraments displayed in our church were made and donated by Ginna Wandel, a former member here.
