SIX REASONS TO LOVE THE CHURCH:


- 1. It is the only institution that Jesus builds and promises to bless.

The second Sunday in Advent 2021 a young family came up to read the devotions. I didn't know them. Did you?

They visited the first time in February of 2021. Ben Burkholder welcomed them and Kelly Laird made them feel comfortable leaving their now 1 ½ year old Molly in the nursery. It wasn't long until their search for a "sound" church was over and they were part of a care group with the O'Briens, Lukases, Hoovers, Nichols, and Haveners.

I'll share some of what I learned when I interviewed them in their West View home not far from my home. Cari and Steve met through Christian Mingle but the radius that each of them set to meet people did not intersect. Divine Providence helped Steve to find Cari's profile.

Both Steve and Cari grew up in Christian families. Steve was the middle child of 5 with his younger two siblings being adopted from Bolivia and Guatemala. Cari's father is a fourth generation farmer and she is the oldest of 4 children. Steve graduated from Widener University with a major in Criminal Justice. Cari graduated from Roberts Wesleyan University with a Nursing degree. Steve has been in the Army Reserves for almost 8 years now. He did software support for Frontline Education and is currently working remotely for Copado as a "Customer Success Architect."

Cari's first jobs were in Critical Care Units in Buffalo and then Rochester. She was employed as a "travel nurse" in Cooperstown, NY and Steve was in West Chester, PA when they met on Christian Mingle in September of 2016. As the relationship grew, Cari was able to take a traveling nurse contract in Philadelphia for January – July of 2017. Philadelphia is much closer to West Chester than Cooperstown and their circles more easily intersected. They were engaged in March of 2017. They were married near Cari's home town of Alden, NY (close to Buffalo) December 16, 2017.

Fortunately for NPC they chose to live in Pittsburgh because it was between their families in Alden, NY and West Chester, PA. Not knowing anyone in Pittsburgh made their first years together as a married couple tough. Hopefully we can make them feel part of a church family.

Steve has shared his musical talent on the electric guitar with the worship team. Cari jumped in to organize the Women's Christmas Tea this year, is helping to clean the church nursery, and has become part of MOMS Ministry. Steve's favorite scripture is Jeremiah 17:7-8 and Cari's is Hebrews 12:1. If you read both of them you will see that they both realize that they are just beginning their journey together serving God and raising a family.

They have a wild and crazy dog named Katie that fortunately is great with their daughter Molly. They both like to get outside. Steve enjoys playing music. Why not share that with them as an affirming word when you leave? Acts of **BLESS**ing can be small. They just need to be intentional.

Great question! Things do seem a little harder during the cold, winter months. Maybe it would **BLESS** your neighbors just for you to get to know them. Winter is a lonely time. There are certain activities that draw my neighbors out of their house even during the cold, snowy days...

- Walking the dog
- Shoveling the driveway
- Getting the mail
- Taking out the trash

These are a few that I can think of. You could make it a point to watch/listen for them and then go out at the same time that they do to...

- Go for a walk
- Shovel your driveway
- Get your mail
- Take out your trash

While you "happen" to be out at the same time as them, approach them to say hello and ask how they are doing. You may be surprised at their willingness to engage your question. Try to listen well, follow up with more questions and take a mental note of something you could ask the next time you "happen" to bump into them. — CHOOSY MOM

- Drive downtown and deliver a blanket and McDonald's gift card to a homeless person.

- Share a puzzle that you've completed.

ALPHA

Have you ever wanted to watch someone realize their broken past can be forgiven and discover that God's grace and mercy are large enough to include them as well? Alpha is a chance for you to do just that. What is Alpha? Alpha involves a number of things. First of all, it involves building relationships over food. Like Jesus who built relationships with all sorts of people over food, Alpha allows time for people to build relationships over something that we share in common: our need for food. Second, it involves watching a video series that does a beautiful job of articulating the Christian faith with compelling examples and testimonies. Even as a life-long Christian, I find them inspiring. The episodes range from 20-30 minutes long. Third, it involves shared discussion over the videos. To be clear, people are free to express their questions, their doubts, and their concerns. We don't expect people to give a textbook answer but instead give them space to wrestle honestly and openly. You will be surprised at what people share, even when you go through Alpha with people you've known for a long time.
