HYMN OF THE DAY: Our hymn of the day is *What A Friend We Have in Jesus*. In our Gospel reading, we watch as Jesus acts as a friend to people who are burdened and suffering. He frees a man from Satan's oppression. He heals a woman of her sickness and relieves her suffering. He is a friend like no other, a friend who bears all our sins and all our suffering. A friend who shares our sorrows as his own. A friend who knows how best to supply our every need and comfort us in every grief. Since we have such a friend, why not call on him in every need? Take it to the Lord in prayer.

A WORD: Our Old Testament reading is the call of Jeremiah. God tells Jeremiah that he had appointed him a prophet before Jeremiah was even born. God chose Jeremiah to be a prophet, and he has chosen us to be his children, long before we were born. The knowledge of God's choice comforts us in every trial. In the Gospel lesson, we see Jesus bring the kingdom of God to the sick and suffering through his powerful Word. He still brings the kingdom of God to us today, and he will bring it perfectly to us on the last day. So we pray to him, "Thy kingdom come."

The epistle reading directs us to love one another with the perfect love of God. While we will never embody God's love perfectly, it is our joy to know that we have received God's love from Christ, and to share that love with others as Christ enables us.
