SEEING IS BELIEVING, OR SO THEY SAY

Have you heard that we have an art exhibit coming to St. Paul's in Lent?

Hopefully that's a joke, because I truly hope you've heard about *The Saint John's Bible* exhibit that will be here for five weeks. There is so much that we will be learning about *The Saint John's Bible* while it's here: the dream that brought it to life, the incredible artists and calligraphers who poured years of their life into this project, the fact that this was the first time in 500 years that a Bible project like this was completed, and more.

But, why? Why undertake such an endeavor?

Quite simply, the answer is the Word. This is God's Word brought to life in a whole new way. Okay, it's not "new" because religious art has been around for centuries, but this is art that illuminates God's Word in a way that is meant to connect with us and our lives today.

During the season of Lent, instead of only reading the Bible or hearing scripture read to us, we will be doing some "holy looking" or "divine seeing." You will be invited to look at an image

and pray with it. How might the elements of the artwork set your mind on prayer, or open your heart to experience God's Holy Word from a new outlook? I imagine each and every one of us will see and experience something different in all of these illuminations. (An illumination is the product of an artist who has taken a passage of scripture and made it "luminous or shining" through art and interpretation.)

I also wonder how this exhibit can get us thinking creatively about, well, everything! Could this unleash an inner artist inside of you? Or might it allow you to experience God in a way you hadn't before? We are planning some different activities that will invite you to try some different things. Because, really, when was the last time many of us colored with a crayon??

I could go on and on and on about this opportunity – we've been dreaming about it for over two years now – but I'll simply invite you to come and experience it. Help us spread the word about it this month, and make plans to join us for opening weekend events on March 6!

LENTEN SEASON

The season of Lent starts a little later this year, but we hope you will make plans to join us for many of our Lenten activities. Please mark your calendars:

<u>Ash Wednesday</u>: Wednesday, **March 2**, Worship at 7:00 pm.

<u>CCACA Lenten Breakfasts</u>: The Church Alliance hosts their weekly breakfasts each Wednesday morning at 7:30 am, starting on **March 9**, in the St. Paul's Fellowship Hall.

<u>Soup Supper</u>: A light supper will be offered each Wednesday evening before the midweek Lenten services, starting on **March 9**, at 6:00 pm in the Fellowship Hall.

<u>Midweek Worship</u>: We gather for worship in the Fellowship Hall, this year surrounded by the images from *The Saint John's Bible*, each Wednesday starting on **March 9**, at 7:00 pm. Refreshments will be served after the service.



THE SAINT JOHN'S BIBLE

Don't forget! During Lent 2022, we will be hosting an art exhibit of seventeen prints from The Saint John's Bible, a fully handwritten and illuminated Bible commissioned by The Saint John's Abby in Collegeville, Minnesota. This is a world-renowned project that is both a work of art and a work of theology. This Bible brings us the Word of God through visual art. We hope that many people will come see it!

This exhibit kicks off on Sunday, March 6, with a special program and the first opportunity to see the prints. We welcome Rev. Michael Patella, Professor of Theology and New Testament at Saint John's University, who chaired the Committee on Illumination and Text for *The Saint John's Bible*. He will be with us for what we expect will be a wonderful day on **March 6**: 9:00 am – Sunday School program about monasticism and the tradition of illuminated Bibles.

10:00 am – Our worship service will include Father Patella and a brief introduction into experiencing the Word of God through *visio divina*.

11:00 am – A fully catered meal is offered.

12:15 pm – Father Patella will introduce *The Saint John's Bible*, discuss many of the prints that are on display (why were these verses chosen for illumination when others were not) and offer ways that these images can be used in our Lenten practices.

Following the opening weekend, the Fellowship Hall will be open to the public on Thursdays (starting **March 10**) from 12:00 pm – 7:00 pm, and Fridays and Saturdays from 10:00 am – 4:00 pm. The exhibit will be set up through **April 6**. Other times during the week for groups and visitors to view the exhibit can be made by calling the church office for an appointment. A bookstore will also be available to purchase materials related to *The Saint John's Bible*.

Volunteers (members and nonmembers) will be on hand to welcome visitors during those times. If you are interested in volunteering, please let us know if you haven't already. We will have a short volunteer training session after worship on Sunday, **February 20th** in the Sanctuary. We are so excited to host this exhibit! Please remember, though, that the Fellowship Hall will be unavailable for most other uses during these five weeks.
