## I Am Weak, But...

Achilles was a vicious warrior with a complicated history. In Homer's Iliad, we see him rise to the top as the preeminent player at the end of the Trojan War. His full backstory is melodramatic but, suffice it to say, there was no one was quite like him. Achilles was simultaneously filled with rage and meticulous in skill as he led the Greeks in battle. But most of us probably only know him because of his heel. Achilles doesn't die in Homer's story but Greek legend says that he later suffered a mortal wound to the back of his foot. The "Achilles' heel," as it's called today, has become one of the most popular idioms in Western culture. It refers to a person's point of weakness leading to their downfall. But that idea comes from Greek mythology, not Christian reality. God's wisdom gives us another picture. Believers in Jesus don't have an Achilles' heel, we are an Achilles' heel.

Here's what I mean: Greek mythology shows us an invincible warrior with one weakness that when exploited leads to defeat; Christian reality shows us a savior, that suffering and death appeared to be His weakness, but when exploited lead to triumph. That's our story. That's the trail that Jesus blazes <sup>21</sup>To this you were called, because Christ suffered for you, leaving you an example, that you should follow in his steps. (1 Peter 2:21).

A hero died for villains. Victory came through loss. Life was born out of death. Conquest was accomplished by suffering. The darkest night in history gave way to the brightest morning. In God's economy, our weakness is one of our greatest assets.

Before we get into an area of looking at how our weaknesses can help us, we need to have a proper understanding of what weakness is. Let's take a moment to define weakness.

First let begin with what weakness is not. The biblical concept of weakness does not mean the things we're not good at. We're tempted to think this way. It would be easier if weakness were contained to the things we stink at doing. But it's much more pervasive than that. We can't simply tiptoe around it.

Weakness is everywhere in the New Testament. Jesus told his disciples that, in contrast to the spirit, the flesh is weak <sup>38</sup>Watch and pray so that you will not fall into temptation. The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak." (Mark 14:38).

Luke, in Paul's voice, refers to the weak as those who are economically disadvantaged. <sup>35</sup>In everything I did, I showed you that by this kind of hard work we must help the weak, remembering the words the Lord Jesus himself said: 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.' " (Acts 20:35).

The Corinthian believers were weak in the social sense <sup>26</sup>Brothers and sisters, think of what you were when you were called. Not many of you were wise by human standards; not many were influential; not many were of noble birth. <sup>27</sup>But God chose the foolish things of the world to shame the wise; God chose the weak things of the world to shame the strong. (1 Corinthians 1:26–27).

The Book of Romans tells us that Jesus died for us while we were still weak, that is, while we were ungodly and lacked any possibility of deserving the slightest good *But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us (Romans 5:8).* 

But we are also weak when we pray, when we lack the words or know-how <sup>26</sup>In the same way, the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us through wordless groan (Romans 8:26).

Also throw in this pile the physical illnesses that Paul seems to cite in 2 Corinthians 10:10, the thorn in the flesh in 2 Corinthians 12:7, and the list of unpleasantness in 2 Corinthians 12:10 10 That is why, for Christ's sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong. One way or another, we have felt the way the Bible speaks about weakness.

The context, of course, determines the specific meaning of weakness but every use is connected back to the general idea of deficiency. If there were one broad explanation for weakness, it would be "to lack".

Weakness means we don't have what it takes. It means we are neither sovereign, nor omniscient, nor invincible. We are not in control, we don't know everything, and we can be stopped. Weakness means that we desperately need God. And the plea for my own soul, and for yours, is that we would embrace weakness, not despise it.

When we embrace our weakness, we know that God's work must be done in God's power. And if it's on God, we can dream big. He is strong enough to do whatever he wants <sup>6</sup>The Lord does whatever pleases him, in the heavens and on the earth, in the seas and all their depths (Psalm 135:6).

He is good enough to not spare his own Son but give him up for us all <sup>32</sup>He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all—how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things (Romans 8:32)?

And with a God that strong and that good, the question we must ask ourselves is what we are asking Him. In the new heavens and new earth, when our faith becomes sight and we behold the glory of Christ, we will not think back to our time now and say, "You know, my dreams for God's glory were way too big." We won't ever say that. Because this is Christian reality, not Greek mythology.

I want to challenge you today with this. It is a very simple line in a hymn...I am weak, but Thou art strong. Friends, God is calling you in your weakness to come before Him and to allow Him to do a great work in you. There is nothing that is not redeemable. Nothing!

But I know this - God can heal, God can redeem, God can put us back on the right track, and God can bring good things from bad situations. Don't lose faith. Don't forget that God still loves you, has things for you to do, and has a blessing with your name on it.

#### "I know the plans I have for you, plans for good and not for disaster, to give you a future and hope." Jeremiah 29:11

Take opportunities to talk and interact with the Lord. Adam took the time to walk with God - to do life with God. ## Nearer My God

Each year, rather than a New Year's "resolution," I try to set a new focus for myself in my spiritual walk with the Lord. I have written about this more than once in the past, usually around this time of year, as I am starting out. Generally, as the previous year starts to draw to a close, I pray for God to send me something, a concept, a verse, a goal, something to be my spiritual focus for the year. Of course, He never fails. I have started past years with focuses like submitting to His will, appreciating true joy over happiness, and working extra hard to truly love everyone-even the unlovable.

This year God gave me James 4:8: "Draw near to God and He will draw near to you…" He wants me to draw nearer to Him, to get closer, and to really understand what that means. At first I thought I had a pretty good idea of what that meant, I mean, how hard can that concept be? But the more I thought about it and prayed on it, the more I realized it's a much larger concept than I ever thought.

I'm obviously not the first person to ask this spiritual question. Dozens of songs have been written about it; the old hymn Nearer My God to Thee, the gospel song Just a Closer Walk with Thee, and contemporary worship songs like Closer, Draw Me Close to You, and Draw Near, just to name a few. Books have been written, sermons have been preached...sermon series have been preached, movies have been made, and a google search of "how to draw near to God" yields almost three and a half million results. Apparently, like me, countless other believers have tried to wrap their head around this big question (that really should be so simple) and have found themselves starting down a much bigger challenge than they realized.

And so here I go, wish me luck as I dive into the process of drawing near. I'm not horribly worried about it, the key seems to be right there in the first sentence...the first words of James 4:8. It's a charge, a command, a task. The author is telling us that we need to initiate the act. We need to draw near to Him first and then He will reciprocate. I have a sneaking suspicion though, that as I start to figure all this out, I'm going to find that he's always been a whole lot closer than I realized.



As we finish year-end paperwork, thank you's, grant reports, etc. here at Doorstep, life has not stopped, and the phone calls keep coming for assistance!

In many ways 2021 felt like a repeat of 2020, in good ways though too. Our member congregations, and the Topeka community, continued to step up and support Doorstep, and the services we offer. We received more CARES funds to assist with rent assistance. And, for the many other people who still had "life happen" to them like non-COVID times, we did our best to help with all of those in need that we could.

In 2021, Doorstep spent \$342,434 on emergency services; this is over \$91,000 more compared to 2020. It was a challenging year, and our small staff is incredibly grateful to our volunteers who kept coming in week after week to help us provide services, sort donations, and help clothing room clients. We also feel very blessed by the support we have received from the Topeka community during this time!

**SouperBowl Sunday is February 13th** and we are again asking our member congregations to collect soup and crackers to help stock our food pantry! Watch for sales and gather your donations! We can use all varieties of soup, and crackers. A successful SouperBowl Sunday can stock our pantry with these items into the Spring months!

In June we had our 55th Anniversary Kick-off to raise funds for a new HVAC system at Doorstep. The current system, original to the building, is over 60 years old. At year end, we had donations of \$50,000! That is 1/3 of the amount needed...we have another \$100,000 to go! We are working on a match donation opportunity in February, and more information will be coming...

Unfortunately, with COVID still an issue, we will not have Operation Soup Line in 2022.

Finally, **Thank You** to everyone who donated money, blankets, games, puzzles and hygiene items for **Doorstep's Christmas Project** this past December! We assisted a total of **259 households with 822 individuals**! Hopefully, next year we can be back to "normal" with the actual Christmas Store.

# THE PERSECUTED CHURCH



### HAMZA: Christian Beaten for Leading Muslim to Christ

Hamza, who grew up in a Christian family indebted to a brick-kilo owner, didn't experience persecution until he brought a Muslim to church. The kiln owner had no problem with Hamza attending church, but their relationship changed drastically when Hamza took a Muslin coworker to church and the man came to faith in Christ. Shortly after that the kiln owner met Hamza at the entrance to his church and beat him so badly that his shoulder was broken. Despite the injury and his treatment by the owner, Hamza continued to work toward paying off his debts.

In 2017, Hamza was sold to another brick-kiln owner and continued to work to pay off his debt to the previous owner. But persecution from the pervious owner did not stop. In September 2019, two men on a motorcycle stopped Hamza as he was walking home from the market and beat him again. Hamza said they were acting on orders from his former owner.

On November 30, 2020, Hamza was able to pay off his debt to the brick-kiln owner with help from VOM. He and his family also received a rickshaw that they can use to start a taxi service. "Hamza was happy and thankful to the team for their help," a VOM worker said.

Hamza said that despite his difficult life, he has never lost hope in Jesus Christ. "He has answered my prayers and now blessed me with a wonderful gift," he said.

Continue to pray for Hamza and his family. Although free from debt, they will face ongoing discrimination in Pakistan, where Christians are a small minority.
