Jana Inglehart is a career missionary who promotes and facilitates the mission work in the Dominican Republic. She takes photos, writes stories, and maintains the Latin America section of the LCMS website. Recently, she designed diplomas for each seminary graduate and prepared the 2022 catalog of giving opportunities. She reports that in La Paz, Honduras, Alliance Missionary Pastor Junior Martinez from Nicaragua has been faithfully proclaiming God's Word and the people have responded. He began his teaching in his home and now the congregation needs a larger worship facility. In Santo Domingo, Missionary Pastor Lucas Elberhardt from Brazil shares the Gospel to the community by offering music lessons, volleyball camps, and other youth activities. Recently, eight precious people received new life in Christ through the water of Holy Baptism. Thank God for the rapid growth of the missions and congregations across Latin America.
