

Dear Friends,

The year 2022 marks the 150th anniversary – the sesquicentennial – of New Market, and, just as importantly for us, of our church. Back in 1872, our congregation would have been organized under the auspices of the Methodist Episcopal Church, the moniker most Northern Methodists went by from the founding of our nation until a major merger in 1939. The "M. E. Church" was a driving force in American frontier history, and through most of the 1800s a Methodist congregation appeared in almost every small town to hit the map. New Market was no exception to that rule. Within one year, in 1873, the core of our current church building had been erected, and a century and a half of history was underway.

Like countless small congregations before it, across the world and through the centuries, our little church has made a meaningful impact in the lives of many, by saving souls, teaching the faith, equipping the saints, assisting the poor and hungry, and being present with the sick and lonely. Most of this work has gone on behind the scenes. Most of it is forgotten. But the effects of our church upon thousands of lives remain.



The work is far from done. Two years ago this month I encouraged us to push ahead with a slogan of "Invite, Involve...Inspire!" Within a matter of weeks Covid-19 came along and changed everyone's plans, everywhere. We have survived, and the time has come once more to push ahead. And what better year to grow our church than our sesquicentennial year?

A few months ago, a thought occurred to me: we are called to be "the hands, the feet, and the voice of Jesus," in and around our community. The hands to do Christ's work, the feet to go where needed, and the voice to share the Gospel and preach the transformative power of God. As we enter 2022, I encourage us to do just that, to be the Hands, the Feet, and the Voice of Jesus for our place and for our times. Never in my lifetime has America (if not the world) had such a need for spiritual direction. And daily, the physical and emotional needs of our society grow, in the wake of brokenness, loneliness, fear, and despair. The world needs the church, and New Market needs *our* church. Jesus gives us a purpose and a role to play. Let us live it out, and change our little corner of the world for the sake of God.

2021 OUTREACH SUMMARY

Matthew 7:12 "In everything, do to others what you would have them do to you...."

The Outreach/Missions committee provides the congregation with the opportunities to actively participate in mission activities on a local, state, national and international level. It educates the laity on missions. Included in this ministry category are Church World Service projects, local needs, and national and international projects sponsored by the United Methodist Church.

MINISTRY HIGHLIGHTS:

- *Sponsored three blood drives which collected a total of 28 pints of whole blood and 8 pints of double red cells. Some other people attempted to donate but were deferred.
- *Collected monetary offerings for Habitat, FISH, Blanket/Tool (CROP walk donation was given to the FISH food pantry.)
- *Sent a box of used greeting cards to St. Jude's Ranch for Children for their mission project.
- *Delivered Amerigas coupons to New Market Elementary
- *Collected food, clothing, and linens for the FISH pantries throughout the year.
- *Worked regularly at the local FISH clothing pantry.
- *Collected Christmas gifts for Montgomery County Mental Health Christmas Program.
- *Coordinated the congregation's schedule to ring the Salvation Army bell.
- *Volunteered in different areas in the community (free clinic, schools, Christmas dinner in Crawfordsville, Wesley Thrift Shop, etc.)
- *Coordinated donating money to UMCOR
- *Sponsored four Food Finders food drives helping approximately 381 families. Local churches and community people helped. A fifth drive was canceled by Food Finders because of snow. Extra food was to local church food pantries.
