The cloud of dust comes over the horizon and soon the source comes near. There is John Wayne, leading a group of settlers in wagons, being chased by the Indians. Soon, he stops and yells, "Circle the wagons" and the movement of chaos running out of control, changes. Soon, all the wagons are gathered in a circle that offers them protection and safety from the onslaught. In their circle, they are able to better manage what lies ahead.

The circle has always been a part of our lives. From the earliest of times, we would gather around the fire to share our stories and experiences. It provided us safety as we gather around a fire. In Biblical times, the second chapter of Numbers, recounts the beginning of the tabernacle in the wilderness and how the tribes would set up camp around the tent of meeting where the presence of God would reside. It is there in center where their identity was found.

In the old favorite gospel song, we sing of another circle, one that brings us hope. "Will the Circle be Unbroken" is a haunting reminder of the power of the circle of life and of how one life intersects with another. The song calls us to remember those saints who have gone on before us to heaven, recalling how they sat around teaching you stories of faith and hymns of praise. One verse says, "You can picture happy gath'rings 'Round the fireside long ago," recalling those memories of days gone by and the promise that the circle will be unbroken as we join them in the sky.

This is a seasons of circles. Soon, you will gather around a table to give thanks. And then, the season of advent is upon us as we prepare to celebrate the birth of Christ. One of the traditions we cherish is that of the advent wreath. It is a circle of garland with four candles (three purple and one pink) surrounding a white candle. A candle is lit each Sunday of Advent. The first purple candle is the candle of the Prophecy or candle of hope. The second purple candle is the manger or Bethlehem candle which reminds us of love. The third candle is the pink candle which is the Shepherds candle or the candle of joy. The fourth candle is the last purple which is called the Angels candle or candle of peace. The center candle is lit on Christmas Eve as we celebrate the coming of Christ.

This holiday season as we gather and celebrate, let us give thanks for all the blessings God has given us and share the story of the coming of our Savior, Jesus. Celebrate those traditions that you cherish and pass them on to the future generations. Tell your story of Jesus love for you. Bring others into the circle whose center is Christ our Lord.
