HYMN OF THE DAY: Our hymn of the day is *O Master, Let Me Walk with Thee.* All of us are called to walk with Jesus, just as Jesus called Peter in the Gospel lesson. Since we will encounter difficulty, we pray that Jesus would help us bear the strain of toil and the fret of care. Since we will have the opportunity to witness, we ask Jesus to help us to move the slow of heart by some winning word of love. Since the road is long, we ask Christ to teach us patience. Finally, we pray for hope that sines far down the future's broadening way and the peace that only Christ can give. We ask that as we have walked with Christ on earth, so we would live with Christ in heaven.

A WORD: Our Old Testament reading is the call of Isaiah. Isaiah is a sinful man, but when the coal from the altar touches his lips, he is cleansed of his sin and prepared to receive God's Word. God's forgiveness and God's Word prepare Isaiah to be God's prophet. We meet another sinful man in the Gospel lesson, Peter. Jesus calls Peter to be a fisher of men, but Peter will only win souls for Christ as he casts the net of the Gospel (preaches the Word) at Christ's command.

Paul concludes his teaching on spiritual gifts by exhorting the Corinthians to desire the gifts that build up the church. God has gifted each of us in various and unique ways, but every gift is best used when it is used in service to God's people.
