2021 was a year filled with joys and challenges for all of us. But through the highs and lows, as the psalmist sings, "The Lord is gracious and compassionate, and abounding in steadfast love." This community of faith has been innovative and is learning new things. This community of faith has been generous, as seen in the generosity of time, talents, and giving in 2021. This community of faith has been active and serving in the community.

Some highlights from 2021 include:

- Adult Ed/Faith formation We had two wonderful adult ed opportunites Engaging Scripture and Contemplative prayer. Pastoral Intern Lucas helped lead these events. I was grateful for these times together.
- Use of technology Church council decided to livestream every Sunday service for the forseeable future. Through the live stream we offer another option for worship and reach people who can not be with us physically. We are making more use of our Facebook page, which is currently up to 236 members. We look forward to other opportunities to use technology in sharing the love of Christ.
- Internship Supervisor I was the supervisor for pastoral intern Lucas Shurson in 2021. It was a joy and a privilege to accompany him on his internship year. The internship program is a great example of a ministry we can provide through collaboration with other churches.
- COVID innovations COVID is certainly not a highlight, but our responses showed creatvitity and adaptability. For instance, we altered some worship practices, and established a safety team to help deal with the on-going covid challenges.
- Conversations on Race and Culture We had a number of conversations on race and racial justice in 2021. We used resources such as the ELCA Social Statement entitled "Race, Ethnicity, and Culture," "A Good Time for Truth" (essays written by Minnesota authors,) and had Lenten forums. I am encouraged by how these difficult conversations went.
- Dennison's Outreach Vision Shelved for a time with the onset of the pandemic, Dennison began enacting
 pieces of an outreach plan in 2021, including establishing two innovative worship opportunities Songs of My
 Life and Taize evening prayer. Next steps include continued outreach, and seeking ways to host more
 community events at DLC.
- Family Ministry The Family Ministry team has been working hard in the midst of challenging times, and has been having good conversations about what family ministry can look like in the midst of a changing culture. I also learned how many people love bingo!
- ELCA Youth Gathering We currently have 16 people signed up for the ELCA Youth Gathering this summer in Minneapolis. This is very exciting! In addition, there will be 3 youths attending a pre-gathering event called MYLE (Multicultural Youth Leadership Event) which empowers young people of color. Be looking for future fundraising activities.
- We have served in the community in a variety of ways, including the Growing Connections garden, the availability and distribution of homemade meals, and several community service activities at Christmas time, including the Christmas Sharing program and a generous gift given through ELCA Good Gifts.

 Ministry in the community – I am grateful for opportunities to serve in the community, including participating in a pen pal program for people in ICE detention through an organization called "Conversations with Friends," and participating in a mentorship program through the KW schools.

Of course, amid highlights there are also challenges. Challenges of course include on-going covid challenges and concerns. Worship and Sunday school attendance seems to be not as high since the onset of the pandemic. And there is always on-going discernment about where God is calling this community and how we can best witness to the love of Christ.

There is much to look forward to in 2022. Some focuses I will be bringing into 2022 include: Providing adult ed/faith formation opportunities (including contemplative prayer practices,) youth and family ministry, continued conversations on race and culture, and getting a worship team established to assist with creative worship planning.

As we look back at 2021, I hope we can celebrate the ways that the Spirit moves in and among this church. As we look ahead to 2022, I pray we can listen together for where the Spirit is leading.

I am often asked what my vision for the synod is, and my reply is always the same: that we would be a people walking together for the sake of the proclamation of the gospel of Jesus Christ. I know that how we live into that proclamation in our particular communities and congregations will change with the resources we have and the context in which we serve. How we proclaim is nuanced, but what we proclaim (the gospel!) is unified and unchanged.

It seems fitting to pause, reflect upon, and give thanks for all the ways the Spirit has invited us into this holy vocation of proclamation in 2021.

For the first time ever, the Southeastern Minnesota Synod hosted a one-day digital Synod Assembly. We learned some things along the way. Overall, the Assembly was a success: we accomplished necessary business, heard from ministry partners, celebrated some milestones, and cast our sight toward the coming year. It is our hope and plan to meet in person for Synod Assembly in 2022. We will, of course, make adjustments as necessary.

As COVID ebbs and flows, so too has our ability to gather in person. We have continued to take full advantage of all digital and hybrid options, and, as we have been able, we've had inperson gatherings, too. 2021 allowed us to host gatherings for pastors and deacons new to the synod, retired rostered ministers and spouses, and candidates for ordained ministry.

Pastors, deacons, and church professionals were able to gather for a few days this fall to explore together the theme of Embracing Sabbath. The learnings that happened during that retreat are already being shared in congregations across the synod.

While our ability to physically visit our global partners has been hindered, our connections with them remain strong. We have continued regular conversation and partnership with our siblings in Colombia, South Sudan, Tanzania, and ministries at our southern border.

The greatest joy of 2021 has been being present with congregations again. The Office of the Bishop staff and I have delighted in worshipping with you on Sunday mornings, enjoying outdoor fellowship and festivities over the summer months, and sitting around meeting room tables as we discern the work of God together.

It is my fervent hope that in 2022 our ability to gather together will only increase and that we will continue on the road of gospel proclamation together.

The Lutefisk Committee found ways to cut down on waste products and be more environmentally aware for the 2021 Lutefisk Supper. They found different, more environmentally friendly, take-out boxes, and planned their purchasing so that there were not a lot of containers remaining at the end of the night.

Our committee hosted a Nor-Wex party in November. Our hostess, Linda Rowan, gave a wonderful demonstration of the environmental benefits of using Nor-Wex products and towels. Sales from the party qualified us for \$179.00 in product for church cleaning, and Linda personally donated \$150.00 toward the steeple repair project.

In 2021 we had a number of projects that were worked on:

The large wooden doors on the west side of the church had deteriorated and needed to be replaced. The doors were rebuilt by Nerstrand Custom Cabinets. The original metal parts and glass were reused and the doors were also able to be installed in the church without changing the door casing or hinges. The original doors were taken to their shop and copied with some changes in glass insulation to keep water from getting into the wood layers of the door. The Sviggum's and Maring families donated the cost of the doors. The doors are presently stained and varnished on the outside, but in the future the outside may need to be painted.

The parking lot has been needing to be resealed and repaired for a number of years. In the fall we were able to get Seykora Company from Owatonna, Mn to remove some deteriorating asphalt and seal the rest.

We have lost some of the pine trees around the church. Dee Larson is developing a plan for the church landscaping and grounds, so we have a list of the kind of trees and location that will serve us best in the future. A memorial tree from the Warner Family was planted on the southeast side of the church.

The church steeple will continue to be our major problem. Planning for work on the steeple started in 2019 when major leaks occurred. In 2020, a couple of projects were done. L and M construction rebuilt the cricket between the steeple and the church roof and increased the pitch to get water away faster. Later it was found that water was also coming in from higher up on the steeple. Emery Maher donated time and materials to repair some holes they found in the steeple window sills and other miscellaneous leaks. There were still more leaks to be found and repaired. In the summer and fall of 2021 contractors did not have time to do repairs. Late in the fall we were able to get River City Builders of Nerstrand who came and made temporary repairs to try and keep water out this winter and during early spring rains. The costs to date on the steeple are: in 2020 \$3,523.00, in 2020 \$7,500 (donated), and in 2021 \$5,707.00. We are trying to obtain some proposals to cover the problems we have. We are looking for grants and are keeping a separate account of steeple donations we receive.
